Thoughts & prayers from Fr. Tony

Passion (Palm) Sunday

"Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord."

Today, the people of Jerusalem are in a frenzy. Jesus – "the one" who made the blind see, the lame walk, the deaf hear and the dead come back to life - is making a triumphal entry into their city on a donkey's back. The children ran to meet him while the very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road. Others cut branches from the trees and strewed them on the road exclaiming "Hosanna!" Here comes "the one" to fulfill the new covenant... come let us celebrate!

Absurdly, this triumphal entry also signifies Jesus' entry into his own passion and death. "My God, my God why have you abandoned me." It was a sorrowful lament which speaks of the anguishing reality of the present but undoubtedly magnifies Christ's resolute obedience and profound trust in the Father.

Yes, how many times have our souls screamed out this plea? Hearing stories upon stories during the height of the pandemic...husband and wife lying side by side at the ICU (Intensive Care Unit) ...not knowing that one goes first and the other follows... and young children orphaned. A family of three... two go, one remains. A family of five...three go and two remain. Yes, these stories I hear firsthand and watching their pained faces soaked in tears. I too would cry out "My God, my God why have you abandoned them".

Yet, and quite remarkably, these families remain so faith-filled, so courageous, holding steadfast to their trust in the Lord like it is the only thing that matters in their lives. Through their dark moments, their spiritual dryness, their desolation, they've felt the presence of the Lord IN THEIR MIDST more strongly than ever.

How many times have our souls screamed out this plea?...as we watched the indescribable and heart wrenching struggle, pain and agony of the victims of Ukraine. Indeed, at every mass I celebrate I invite the community to walk in solidarity with them...trying to disembark for them.

"My God, my God why have you abandoned me"...was and is my innate cry in my being "earth trying to kiss heaven, remembering my emotional struggle with Covid and Cancer.



At the hospital during my most difficult time, all I wanted to have was a hand to hold onto...and I felt it was deprived of me. I cried and cried until I could not cry anymore...and perhaps the real cry was that agonizing cry of Good Friday.


But through it all, the Lord has brought me to this day...I praise and bless Him always. Last

Friday (April 8), the Lord has blessed me serving Him as a priest for 49 years. I could not thank enough our faith community and all those who held me by the hand through prayers. I am most grateful to our Bishop Dave and Cardinal Mahony who cradled me when the 'crying out' was so trying. Bishop Dave would assure and reassure me... "Tony, I am here for you and with you...



even if we would hobble together to the finish line."

Yes, at the end it is a true cry of "Hosanna, Son of David! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord". The loudest cry: "Yes Father, not my will but thine be done."

FOR LOVE'S SAKE

"He humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on the cross" (Philippians 2:8).

You have just heard of the greatest brutality in the story of our Christian faith – lies, deception, and mockery, all of which ultimately leading to the crucifixion of our Lord Jesus Christ! Why? Didn't God intend to send him to save us from our sins? Why does it have to end like this? No other religion has a leader who was tortured like Jesus. Why does it have to be our Lord? He was making miracles and he was teaching the things that God wanted us to hear and follow while we are living here on earth. Jesus became a model for us to lead a good and happy life in this world in order to attain eternal life in heaven. But he died because of His obedience and His love for mankind. This kind of love is difficult to follow. However, according to Bishop Barron, "the path of discipleship is the path of selfsacrificing love, and that means the path of suffering."

One of my friends revealed to me a very sad truth about her marriage... she is a battered wife. Her husband is an alcoholic. What is interesting is that you could never tell from the outside that she is going through this. She is one of the jolliest people I have ever met and has the loudest of laughs. Interestingly, I heard from one of the priest's homilies that the person who laughs the loudest is the person who has the most misery. It's an observational fact. At a very vulnerable time, this poor lady questioned God. "Why me? What did I do to suffer this brutality from my husband?" She never had a relationship with God until she found God in the midst of her sorrow and started visiting the church where she found the company of good parishioners. In the church, through daily mass and listening to the daily Word, she came to realize the power of God's love and how God revealed the healing power of prayer. Her husband is still an alcoholic; they live in separate homes but through prayers and through the guidance of the priests and fellow parishioners, she was able to wholeheartedly accept her reality. Through it, she became strong-willed and able to defend and threaten her husband to a point where he was no longer able to carry out his brutality toward

My friend still recalls the pain and suffering that her husband has inflicted, but she is now trustful that God is always on her side.

"The Lord God is my help; therefore, I am not disgraced: I have set my face like flint, knowing that I shall not be put to shame" (Isaiah 4:7).


