





#### THE GREATEST COMMANDMENT

"You shall love the Lord your God and your neighbor as yourself."

One can have all the money, all the titles, and all the possessions while on earth, but at the end of one's life, when we come face to face with God, the question that we must answer is not what we have accumulated or accomplished. The only question God will ask is, 'how much love have you given?'

When I was sorting my closet, I came across our wedding invitation of 39 years and was surprised to see that the very top of the invite was the scripture passage: "Let love be your guide." Reflecting through all the years that we were together, amid the joy, the pain, and the hardships of married life, it was LOVE that carried us through the short time God has blessed us.

So, what is love that makes it the greatest commandment? Most of us love because it is considered as a feel-good emotion. According to Dr. Gary Chapman, author of the Five Languages of Love, different people express love in different ways: verbal, touch, gifts, service, and quality time.

Love is not only an emotion but also a decision and a responsibility. Love is willing the good of the other. In today's Gospel message, Jesus reminds us that the greatest commandment is to love God with all your heart, soul, and mind. And the best way to express this love is to love your neighbor as yourself. Why? God loves your neighbor, too, and that is the person you are close to - your family, your in-laws, your friends, and the strangers and enemies that surround you. Jesus also commanded us to love our enemies. We can say endearing words, hold someone, share our gifts, cry with others, and provide service without loving them.

BUT we cannot love without saying, "I love you"; without holding the hands of the people we love; without sharing our gifts, talents, and treasure; without shedding a tear in the process; and we cannot love without service. For love, according to Pope St. John Paul II, is to is love only when it is lived through self-sacrifice. We need only to look to the Cross to discover what love and Who Love is - Jesus!


