God's Last Will and Testament

"As for you, my sheep, says the Lord God, I will judge between one sheep and another, between rams and goats." (Ezekiel 34:17)

When I was diagnosed with an untreatable condition, I met a Palliative Care doctor who mentioned that I met the criteria to be on Palliative Care Program. I looked at all the options and the guidelines. I signed up for the program and have been on the program for the second year. I discussed with my family the things I prepared. After my husband passed away, I was not just thinking about his death but mine as well. What will happen to my loved ones? Are they prepared to face another mortality event in the family? So, I gradually walked my family through the process of preparing for this event. I prepared an irrevocable trust that includes a living trust, a will and testament, health care directive, appointment of three of them to become the Administrator of my property, and a durable power of attorney for finances.


What is it that my children cannot have when our heavenly Father calls me on my final days? Our faith teaches that ultimately, God will judge us on what we have done to one another - feed the hungry, welcome the stranger, clothe the naked, visit the sick, visit those in prison, bury the dead, and all other corporal works of mercy that Jesus has taught us to do. These are the most important things I need to prepare my children for my death. As St. John of the Cross said, "In the evening of our lives we will be judged on our love."

"Amen, I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me." (Matthew 25:45)

The end of the liturgical year is a time to examine ourselves. What have we done to ensure that God's last will and testament for us is to enter his kingdom? We just finished celebrating thanksgiving and the parish received a lot of donations to feed the hungry and soon we will have to prepare for Christmas gift-giving. Be alert and be prepared for God is our Shepherd: he spreads the table, anoints our head until our cup overflows with blessing so that there will only be goodness and kindness all the days of our life. Our final goal is to dwell in the house of the Lord for years to come.




SLR FRIDAY EUCHARISTIC ADORATION



NOVEMBER 25-26 DID YOU KNOW?

How do groomers work? Groomers start by picking out a potential victim, often a child who is emotionally vulnerable or isolated, or with low self-esteem. Then, groomers will start to slowly build a relationship bonding over an alleged shared interest and expanding relationships out to build trust with the victim's family and friends. Groomers work hard to make themselves appear trustworthy and safe, to gain better access to their victims. From there, they can isolate their victims and perpetrate abuse. 


