

Peace!

When St. Bernard was asked what the four cardinal virtues were, he replied: “Humility, humility, humility and humility.”

Humility is the most misunderstood virtue of our times. Today humility is often deemed synonymous with weakness. However, being humble doesn’t mean suppression of one’s personal attributes or abject self-deprecation. No; this is not its meaning. The humble person knows his or her place and takes it. The humble person who is supposed to rule, rules; and when he or she is supposed to serve, serves. But even in one’s most triumphant moments, the humble person remembers that all he or she is and all that he or she has is from God.

But because of pride and *amor proprio* (self-love, which is very difficult to conquer) the virtue of Humility becomes unpopular. St. Francis de Sales said: “Pride, human pride, dies 15 minutes after your own death!”

CARING FOR CREATION**

*We are all a part of creation and entrusted by God with its care.* Try to eliminate as much disposable plastic from your life as possible; it breaks down into tiny particles that enter streams, lakes and oceans, harming fish and other wildlife. Instead, keep a reusable water bottle; wash and reuse plastic sandwich and snack bags, or replace them with reusable silicone bags or waxed-paper bags, which can be composted. Replace plastic wrap with reusable silicone bowl covers. When buying, choose glass storage containers with covers. Use real plates and flatware in parish activities as well as at home and social get-togethers. Consider bringing your own plate and tableware to activities that involve food within the parish and in the community.
