

From Rejoicing to Sacrifice to Glory

The original Palm Sunday say the people of Jesus' day celebrated His triumphal entry into Jerusalem. They were filled with hope and expectation that the Messiah was in their midst. With the use of palm branches, they made the occasion festive and wanted to savor those moments. Jesus was present to the moment, but anticipated the week that would see sacrament, suffering, and eventual rejoicing with the Resurrection.

I have good memories of my younger years when we would celebrate Palm Sunday and Holy Week. It was a big deal for my home parish at St. Cecilia's in Leominster and later came to understand that it occurred everywhere else. In addition to hearing the Passion of Jesus, we then took the palms home and placed the strands behind the crucifix. We knew that the other faith experiences and practices would be significant. In the retelling of the story of Jesus' sacred meal, crucifixion, and resurrection we would find new life. It was a great tradition that my family and our parish experienced.

I hope and pray that this week which we call holy will be a significant one for you, your family, and friends. Please make an attempt to come to any or all of the services for this week. May we always be open to the richness of these celebrations and find new life in Christ through the experiences of His passion, death, and resurrection.

Have a blessed and grace filled Holy Week and Easter!

Lenten Regulations

GUIDELINES FOR FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Lenten fast and abstinence regulations for the Diocese of Worcester are as follows: **Abstinence** from meat is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen (14) years of age and older on Good Friday.

Fasting is to be observed by all Catholics who are eighteen (18) years of age but not yet fifty-nine (59) years of age on Good Friday. Those who are bound to fast may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed Lenten penitential practices.
