SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER IN BETWEEN

In between: we all find ourselves there from time to time—sometimes uncomfortably. Like in between money coming in and money going out, earning income and paying bills. In between customer and manager, diner and chef: any honest server trying to serve both. In between theory and practice, ideal and reality: everyone from parents to pastors. Ask the kids—or parishioners! This Sunday, in between Ascension and Pentecost, reminds us we’re in between Jesus’ departure and glorious return—sometimes uncomfortably. Though Jesus promises in Revelation, “I am coming soon.” Acts shows Stephen tragically called home first. But Pope Francis urges us not to become “sourpusses,” as if living Gospel love is impossible in between. Today’s Gospel shows Jesus praying for those about to betray, deny, and desert him, but also praying “for those who will believe in me through their word.” Us! “So that they”—we—“may all be one.”

NOVENA TO THE HOLY SPIRIT May 31-June 8

The novena in honor of the Holy Spirit is the oldest of all novenas since it was first made at the direction of Our Lord Himself when He sent His apostles back to Jerusalem to await the coming of the Holy Spirit on the first Pentecost. It is still the only novena officially prescribed by the Church. Addressed to the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity, it is a powerful plea for the light and strength and love so sorely needed by every Christian.

Novenas are located on the back credenzas and at each exit in church.



VASCULAR AND ABDOMINAL ULTRASOUND SCREENINGS

On **June 7, 8, 21, and 22, 2019**, RightWay Imaging will be bringing its mobile unit to **Our Lady of the Rosary’s Vincent Hall (1324 Moss Street)** to perform nine vascular and abdominal ultrasound screenings for Carotid Arteries, Thyroid, Lower Abdominal Aorta, Liver, Spleen, Gallbladder, Right and Left Kidneys, which are non-invasive and painless. These tests are offered for \$45 each, or all 8 screenings for \$159.00, (*approximately \$17 per test*). And, an Electrocardiogram to monitor heart activity for Afibulation. If you are over the age of 35, smoke, are physically inactive, or, if you have high blood pressure, high cholesterol, diabetes, or a family history of stroke, heart disease, or cancer, please take advantage of these tests, and call, **281-616-9192**, to register.

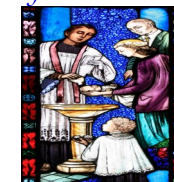

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick offers prayer for healing, hope, and strength and is intended for a Catholic at the beginning of a serious illness, before surgery or weakened due to age or chronic infirmity.

Viaticum, “Food for the Journey”, is Holy Communion with special prayers for the dying and serves as the “last rites” for Catholics who are terminally ill and in the last stages of life.

Our parish clergy are always willing to visit hospitals to pray with and support those who are ill. Sacraments in the hospital are provided by the designated Catholic Chaplain. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion generously make themselves available to bring Holy Communion to the home-bound of our parish. Please contact the Parish Office to arrange for any of these services.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

In accordance with Archdiocesan Policy, couples contemplating marriage are to begin their preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least six months before their anticipated wedding date. Call the Parish Office or visit our website for more information.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents and godparents of children to be baptized are required to participate in Baptismal preparation sessions. This can be done even before the birth of the child. Baptisms, after 11:00am Mass, are scheduled with the Parish Office.
