# SPECIAL SCHEDULE AND **SIGN-UP FOR CHRISTMAS MASSES**

This year of 2020 has been one we will never forget, and the surprises haven't ended yet! Due to COVID-19, and the extraordinary circumstances of social distancing, we have greatly expanding our normal Christmas schedule of Masses.

We will have Masses at 3:00pm, 4:30pm, and 6:00pm on Christmas Eve and at 9:00am and 11:00am on Christmas Day.

The 3:00pm, 4:30pm, and 6:00pm Masses have reached the 175 person limit.

Due to the number of Masses in a short amount of time and the number of people attending our Christmas Eve Masses, all of us will have to work together to make everything work smoothly. Here's how you can help:

- Please only attend Mass if you have signed up. We will not have space for an overflow crowd, especially on Christmas Eve, since those Masses are all full.
- For Christmas Eve Masses, please try to maximize space in the church so that all can socially distance. If you have a small number of people in your household, please try to share a pew with a similar sized group. If you have a large number of people in your household, please try to use just one pew for your group. There will also be folding chairs spaced around the church for extra seating.
- If you are coming to 3:00pm or 4:30pm Mass, please clear the parking lot as soon as possible after Mass to make way for people coming to the next Mass.
- If you are coming to 4:30pm or 6:00pm Mass, please try to arrive in the parking lot no earlier than 15 minutes before Mass. This will allow the congregation for the previous Mass the time to leave and prevent a traffic jam.
- Please make sure that everyone coming to Mass knows that they will need to wear a mask properly for the entire time that they are in church. The mask can only be removed for receiving Holy Communion.
- Most of all, please remember the virtue of patience during this extraordinarily stressful time in an extraordinarily stressful year!
