A Message from Fr. Bob



September 2010 I was on my first longer trip to Stockholm. It was a time to visit friends and explore. At the airport I bought my transit pass and picked up many brochures. The guidebook suggested a visit to Sofia Kyrka - a church fairly close to where I was staying. I knew I couldn't get lost because I could see the steeple. Actually, the hardest part of the adventure was finding the front door. The church has a unique architecture. Once inside I really was impressed. There were no gold or silver adornments. There was an altar, some side altars, some globe candle stands, and a beautiful painting creating an arch around the altar. It was that painting that caught your attention. The guidebooks say it is based on the verse in Micha about turning swords into plowshares. But it was much more than that one scene. On its path to the top of the arch where Jesus welcomed to his kingdom, all of the corporal works of mercy are portrayed. All those acts lead us to Jesus. Todays Gospel says the same. We have to go beyond just saying as Peter said "it's good to be here." The challenge is living that goodness and all the acts that support that goodness. Traditionally we call those acts the corporal works of mercy. Later I found out that this parish tries to center its life on the works of mercy. I was glad I went on the little adventure. If you are in Stockholm, visit Sofia Kyrka in Sodermal. Its worth the visit.

"Children are made readers on the laps of their parents." (Emilie Buchwald)

And principals and teachers encourage reading too! In fact, over the past few months, the entire school participated in a shared reading experience! Grades 2-8 read *Wishtree* by Katharine Applegate and Pre-k through first grade, read a companion storybook called *The Wish Tree* by Kyo Maclear. These are wonderful stories about inclusion, kindness, acceptance and the true nature of friendship.

The purpose of this reading initiative was to create a sense of community through literature. Indeed we did! Each day, immediately following Morning Prayers, the Middle School read together with Ms. Powrie. As teachers, we would then incorporate the story into *every* subject area.

In my Social Studies classes, we have been working on an Identity Project. Inspired by a part of *Wishtree* where a child is adopted and receives her birth name (Amodora, which in Italian means "the gift of love"), my students were tasked with interviewing a parent or family member, to discover the story behind their names! Many discovered the personal or cultural significance that influenced their parents' decision.

From there, the students delved deeper into the characteristics of their families. Who makes up your family? What is your place or order within your family? What is one family tradition you have and why is it important to you? What are your nationalities? Who was the first family member to immigrate to America and when? Where did they come from and why did they leave? What challenges did they face upon arriving in America? What did they overcome?

Each question that was answered, each anecdotal story they heard, connected the students to their own personal history and identity. With a greater sense for who they are, each student will now present a slide show as their Identity Project. I am so excited for us to learn a bit more about one another! Afterall, "He who knows others is wise. He who knows himself is enlightened."



Oh St. Joseph whose protection is so great, so strong, so prompt before the throne of God, I place in you all my interests and desires.






A Journey toward Healing and Hope
