

Legacy of Hope

In a few months, Our Lady of Lourdes Parish will be entering into the diocesan campaign called "Legacy of Hope." As some of you are already aware, Bishop McManus has asked all the parishes of the diocese to join with him in raising \$32 million to assist in very necessary parish and diocesan needs. Legacy of Hope plans to raise at least \$12 million for parishes to do projects and to restore and refurbish their properties. Another \$12 million of the campaign's target will be earmarked to support the needs and custodial care of our diocesan priests in retirement. \$4 million will be designated to address the needs of Catholic education such as our elementary and high schools. \$2 million of the Legacy of Hope will support the diocesan charitable agencies and efforts that Partners in Charity support each year. Finally, \$1.5 million will be used to promote the necessary efforts of our parishes' evangelization to bring Trust, Hope, and Love in our actions as Church.

Our Lady of Lourdes Parish has a target of raising \$201,000 in 4 years. 40% of that, or roughly \$81,000 will return to the parish so that we can address serious restoration and refurbishment needs. I would like to ask you to help me determine where would be the best place to use this money. In the three years I have been with you I have noticed a number of areas of concern. Let me tell you what I have seen.

Church & Rectory Heating System - although the system is running, it nonetheless is old and inefficient. Many of the valves are broken and do not function. There is no useful way to zone the heating which causes us to pay very high heating bills. Sometimes, as you are aware, the church's temperature can vary at times and the building is either too cold or too hot.

Parking Lot & Signage - the condition of our parking lot is deteriorating with huge ruts, cracks and faded demarcations. Although we have signs at each of the entrances of the church, it has been made aware to me that our church has little "curb appeal", that is, something that attracts people to the church. Many have remarked to me that they didn't even know there was a church here.

Handicap Accessibility - one of the odd things about our church building is the fact that unlike the church itself, our parish Hall is not accessible to those with a physical challenge. We have no elevator or ramp from the parking lot to enter the Hall. In order to fulfill our mission as a welcoming and inclusive church it is important that we make all of Our Lady of Lourdes accessible.

Please give it some thought and let me know what your thoughts are on what the money should be earmarked for.
