Next Week's Liturgical Readings

September 27, 2020 – 26th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

- 1) Ezekiel 18:25-28
- 2) Philippians 2:1-11 or 2:1-5
- 3) Matthew 21:28-32

FOCUS: In love, God waits for us to turn to him.

The Father calls each of us, daughters and sons, to participate in his work. Will we go to his vineyard? Even if we have said "no" 10 times, we can turn around! With the Father's help, we can turn from disobedience to obedience – from sinfulness to grace. The Father waits patiently, and is always welcoming.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

In our first reading, the Lord speaks to Israel through the prophet Ezekiel and tells them that the wicked who turn from sin shall live. In today's Epistle, Paul exhorts the Philippians to live in unity, taking Jesus as their example of humility. In the Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the two sons whose father asks them to work in the vineyard; the first son refuses, but later obeys.

At the request of Bishop Crosby, all parishes of the Diocese will celebrate Mass at that time for all who have died of the virus and for those who died during that challenging period. We want to offer our solidarity and support for the families of all who have died during these difficult times, often unable to grieve the loss of a loved one because of the public health restrictions prohibiting a final "goodbye", a proper celebration of life. REFUGEE MINISTRY FUND

September 26-27 weekend

There will be a special collection for our active refugee ministry project. Since the COVID-19 pandemic restrictions began in March, 7 months ago, we have not been able to invite your participation in this parish outreach. Once the travel restrictions have been lifted, we should be ready to welcome our refugee family to the region. We are about \$8,000 short of the goal of \$42,000. Can you help put us "over the top"? We are not permitted to distribute envelopes, or other "touchable" products in Church. We kindly ask you to consider a generous contribution to the Refugee Ministry, our primary social ministry project this year. You can drop your own envelope, marked "Refugee Fund", in the collection basket at the back of the Church next weekend, put it in the mail box of the parish office or mail it to the parish. AND you can promote this parish effort by informing others. Many parishioners do not have internet access and so do not receive the online parish bulletin or the email information we send out. Some have not yet returned to regular Sunday Mass and would love to know and support the good things we are doing. Thanks for showing you care for the poorest and most vulnerable of our society.
