

The origin of the Christmas tree comes from a story from the life of St. Boniface when he set about converting the German people in the 8th century. One evening as the pagans gathered around their sacred Oak, preparing to sacrifice to their gods, St. Boniface chopped down the mighty Oak. It split into four pieces only to reveal behind it a young fir tree. "Here," he said, "is your sacred tree tonight. Note the ever green leaves, a sign of endless life. Let this be called the tree of the Christ child. Gather around it in your home to remind you of the gift of life the Christ child comes to bring you."
