
St. Peter the Fisherman Parish May 5th: 3rd Sunday of Easter

Dear Parishioners,

In today's Gospel, Jesus appears to the Apostles for the third time. This time it is from the shore as they go about their livelihoods as fishermen. When He first met them, Jesus said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." (Mk.4:19) Before they could fully realize what this meant, Jesus had to prepare them for the day he would leave them and Ascend back to His Father. They had to be clear about what was their mission. He lets Peter know in no uncertain terms that this mission would often be difficult, but if he truly loved Him, he would obey and follow Him. Peter was able to do this because he repented of the three times he denied Jesus by professing his love for Him on the shore in today's Gospel. "Simon, son of John, do you love me?," Jesus asks. Peter replies, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." "Feed my sheep," is Jesus' response. In this we see that to truly love Jesus means that we are responsible for sharing that love with others. Today is a great day for St. Peter the Fisherman Parish. On this day, we see Peter being charged with leaving his livelihood as a fisherman to truly become a "fisher of men." May we as humble parishioners of St. Peter the Fisherman parish always be willing to share our love for Jesus with others, even when it might be difficult. May we simply always obey and follow Him as the Apostles did.




Did you know ...

After many years of Christian persecution beginning with Hadrian, in the year 313, Constantine became the Roman Emporer and legalized Christianity. It was at this time that Constantine's mother, St. Helena, converted to Christianity. In 324 AD she went to Palestine with her son's

permission in search of the sacred sites of our Lord Jesus. In the years that followed, she built churches marking the sites of the Nativity in Bethlehem, and the site of the Ascension on the Mount of Olives. During her continued search of the holy sites, she always acknowledged the poor and destitute in the cities she entered, giving clothing to the naked, food to the hungry, and liberation to many of the prisoners. But her efforts didn't stop there.
