Dear parishioners,

We have turned the corner to the beginning of another month. Might we be closer to an end to all of this? Perhaps!, but only time will tell. Let's keep our chins up and our hearts hopeful, as we move through the Easter Season on the way to Pentecost. May the Lord's Spirit be that which gives us the patient endurance to wait on Him as He purifies and perfects our faith.



At this time there isn't much to report regarding immediate changes to Mass attendance in the Diocese of Portland.

In light of Gov. Mills' plan to reopen Maine, it appears that for the remainder of the month of May, there will be no public Masses celebrated in Catholic churches throughout the diocese, as we experienced in April. In accord with Phase I of the governor's plan, Bishop Deeley is allowing parking lot Masses to be celebrated in parishes with the following stipulations: cars need to be parked with one empty space on either side of each car to maintain social distancing protocols, the windows must remain up, only family

members from the same household should be in the car, and there will be no reception of Holy Communion because attendees must remain in the car at all times. For obvious reasons, I am choosing not to celebrate parking lot Masses. For this reason, I encourage all of you to continue in May the routine you settled into in April until Phase II of the governor's plan takes effect in June.

Phase II of the plan is anticipated to begin in June, unless things change for the worse in May. Should things proceed as planned, however, then social gatherings of up to 50 people will be allowed. Because St. Peter the Fisherman Parish is a small parish, it is foreseeable that we may be able to start having Masses again in our parish churches in June. There will need to be some creative planning in order to accommodate everyone at Mass so I will be working on this over the next few weeks. If you have any creative suggestions, please send them to me via email. Once we get closer to June, I hope to be able to update you with a more positive outlook. UNTIL THEN, PLEASE KNOW THAT NO CONCRETE PLANS HAVE BEEN MADE. This is certainly hopeful news, but also certainly not definitive news. Please pray that we continue to move toward a more normal routine.
