

A Way to Celebrate Advent

In the Catholic Church, Advent is a period of preparation extending over the four Sundays before Christmas. The word Advent means "to come to," and refers to the coming of Christ. Advent has been called a "little Lent," because it traditionally has included a period of increased prayer, fasting, and good works. Although the Western Church no longer has a set requirement for fasting during Advent, the Eastern Church (both Catholic and Orthodox) continues to observe what is known as Philip's Fast, from November 15 until Christmas.

Even though how the Roman Catholic Church celebrate advent has changed over time, the church continues to stress the penitential and preparatory nature of Advent. As during Lent, priests wear purple vestments, and the Gloria ("Glory to God") is omitted during Mass. The only exception is on the Third Sunday of Advent, known as Gaudete Sunday, when priests can wear rose-colored vestments.

Many believe the decision to take away such traditional practices is one of the reasons why more Catholics are losing the true spirit of Christmas. I'm not sure how much of that is true; however, I do believe Catholics today (myself included), can do a better job appropriately celebrating Christmas. We can better celebrate and enjoy Christmas—all 12 days of it—if we embrace some of these traditional practices in Church. For example, even though abstaining from meat and giving up sweets in Advent is no longer required, it is encouraged. These practices help us embrace a form of penance and mortification which allows us to appreciate such foods more at Christmas and thus appreciate Christ more. Another practice is not to put all your decorations out until Christmas Eve in order to bring more attention to the day of Christmas. We probably have fallen away from such practices as a result of the over commercialization of the Christmas season in retail stores to maximized profits. I am not saying that we should not celebrate Christmas at all before Christmas Eve, I am just encouraging all of to maybe reduce the celebrating until Christmas Eve so that we can celebrate more fully the true meaning of Christmas—the day of our Lord's Birthday.

Each of the candles represents an aspect of preparation during the season of Advent:

Week 1: The Candle of **Hope-**Color: Purple

Purple is the primary color associated with Advent. Within the Catholic Church it symbolizes penance, preparation, and sacrifice. During the first week of Advent, we look forward to Jesus' coming with hope.


Week 2: The Candle of **Peace**-Color: Purple

During this second week of Advent, we reflect on our lives and work on becoming better-versions-of-ourselves in preparation for Jesus' coming.

Week 3: The Candle of **Joy**-Color: Pink

This third candle is pink, symbolizing anticipation and rejoicing. During the third week of Advent, we are filled with joy for the near arrival of Jesus on Christmas day.

Week 4: The Candle of **Love**-Color: Purple
