Our Mission Statement: In the spirit of Saint Francis, to know Jesus and make Him known.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Lord,

The two biggest sellers in any bookstore these days, according to Andy Rooney, are the cookbooks and the diet books. The cookbooks tell you how to prepare the food, and the diet books tell you how not to eat any of it. A recent survey found that 41% of men and 55% of women consider themselves overweight. In one way or another, many of us are obsessed with earthly food. Think what a difference it would make in our lives if we were equally obsessed with Heavenly Food, the Food that Christ gives us is His own self: Body, Blood Soul and Divinity. The bread is not a symbol of Christ. The Eucharist we receive simply is literally, truly, in the most physical way possible, without any symbolic meaning at all, the Body and Blood of Christ.

For this very reason, the Church wants to bring our attention to the Eucharist, which is the summit of our faith so for five Sundays, the Gospel readings will be taken from the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John, which is also known as the great discourse on the Bread of Life. Since this Bread of Life, Jesus Himself, is available at every Catholic Mass, in every Catholic tabernacle, every time we go to Eucharistic Adoration. We have to ask ourselves, "Why on earth would I ever miss Mass?" Why isn't there a line waiting to get into this place? Why would we ever experiment with a non-Catholic "church?" If the Eucharist is truly the Bread of Life, how can we not kneel and adore?

As human beings, we hunger for many things besides food and material possessions. We hunger to be recognized and honored, to love and be loved, to be listened to and to be appreciated, to help, console and encourage people and receive gratitude. But only God can satisfy our various forms of spiritual hunger. St. Augustine said: "O God, you have made us for Yourself, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You."

What message can we draw from chapter 6 of John's Gospels for our lives?

We need spiritual nourishment from the word of God and from the Holy Eucharist: In the Holy Mass, the Church offers us two types of bread: a) the Bread of Life, contained in God's Word and b) the Bread of Life, contained in the Holy Eucharist. Let us nourish our souls with this Heavenly manna and carry Jesus to our homes and workplaces, radiating his love and mercy all around us. It is perhaps the plainness and ordinariness of the consecrated Bread and Wine and their easy availability in our Churches that sometimes prevent some of us from appreciating the great gift of God in the Holy Eucharist. But we should not take for granted the Divine generosity that provides these gifts so readily and gratuitously by sharing in the Bread of Life simply as a matter of habit and without showing due attention and proper respect.

Let us gain spiritual life and strength by properly receiving the Holy Eucharist: The Eucharist gives us courage to carry out God's work in the world; The Eucharist is an inspiration to know the will of God in our lives; It is a deeper understanding of the holy mystery of Christ's presence; The Eucharist encourages to love others and strengthen the faith community; It supplies Grace to overcome temptation and avoid sin, and the Eucharist is a sign of joy and peace of heart, knowing that Christ lives in us and will bring us to God's Heavenly Kingdom. Hence, we need to receive the Holy Eucharist with our whole minds and hearts. Let us never forget that the "Bread of Life" is Jesus Christ himself, not merely human bread. It is food for our souls giving us a share in God's life. We need to prepare our souls to receive Jesus into our lives in state of grace and the best way is to go to confession often where God cleanses our souls and our hearts to welcome Him into our lives. Other ways we can prepare to receive Jesus is to try our best to come to Mass on time, dress properly and spend some time to give thanks to God after communion instead of be distracted by other things.

Multiply the good works like the loaves and fishes: "Jesus satisfies not only material hunger, but the most profound of hungers, the hunger for meaning in life, the hunger for God. In the face of suffering, loneliness, poverty and difficulties of so many people, what can we do? Complaining, does not solve anything, but we can offer the little that we have. We certainly have a few hours of time, some talent, some expertise. ... Who among us, does not have his or her "five loaves and two fish"? If we are willing to put them in the hands of the Lord, we will bring a little more love into the world; we will be able to cultivate a sense of belonging and being loved and we will be able to bring a little more smile on the faces of many. God is able to multiply our small gestures of solidarity and make us partakers of his gift." Amen.

If you need to register your child for Faith Formation classes and I am not in the office, please download the registration form on the website or you can pick up the forms in the Parish Office from 9-3 p.m. Monday through Thursday.

Each child must register every year.

Our formation classes are continuous and build one year upon the next. Grade 1 is required for First Eucharist preparation and Grades 3-7 are required for Grade 8 Confirmation.

Catechists and Catechists' Assistants are needed. To be a catechist, you do not need to be an expert teacher or a theologian. Catechists are ordinary people who generously give their time to share the Catholic Faith, values, and traditions with the youngest generation of Christians.
