Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This weekend, thousands of pilgrims travel to Washington D.C. for The March for Life. It's an annual rally, march, and praying together for an increase in respect for the dignity of every human life. As we gather on this pro-life Sunday, it is important for us to reflect on the readings that we are given to us by our Mother Church.

This weekend's readings invite us to reflect on the prominent theme that we are called to pray and fast. In other words, the readings called us to repent. To repent means, that we are called to turn away from our sins, and to turn back to the Lord. We cannot love the Lord and continue seeking and living in sin. Once we decide that we love the Lord more than our favorite sins, it is then and only then that we are able to overcome the sin.

In our first reading today, we see that Jonah was sent to the city of Nineveh to call the whole city to repentance. The people listened to Jonah, and repented. We as a nation need to get down on our knees and pray, and we need to fast to end all sins against human life issues.

St. Paul in our second reading today, says that time is running out. Will you consider throwing your sins at the feet of Jesus, and start living for him and his gospel today? Each of us is called to repent, each of us is called to turn away from sin and to return to the Lord.

If we look at our Gospel for today, we see the first words that come out of Jesus' mouth in the gospel of Mark. They are, "repent and believe in the gospel." That means we are to turn away from sin, and return back to the Lord and believe in His good news of salvation.

"Repent, and believe in the gospel" also means "Come follow Me and learn from Me to become like Me." For the first disciples, it meant dropping whatever they were doing to spend so much time with Jesus that their whole lives were forever affected. And this is what it means for you and for me: We have to put aside our own agendas and overly busy schedules to spend more time following Jesus wherever He leads us.

Unfortunately, Jesus doesn't walk through the door and circle dates on our calendar and write "Rest with Jesus" on it so that we can plan ahead. We have to follow His lead at a moment's notice – every moment. To experience the kingdom of God on the earthly side of heaven, we have to be willing to drop everything to follow Jesus into unfamiliar places at unexpected times. We have to learn to follow His lead even in situations where His way is the surprising way.


