Dear St. Francis of Assisi Community,

I am writing to share information regarding the well water quality in our school and parish buildings.

As you may know, the well water at St. Francis is routinely monitored to ensure compliance with public safety standards. This year, the state required a new test to screen for PFAS, also known as the "forever chemical."

Unfortunately, the test results showed levels above the minimum standard. Here is a brief summary of this issue:

- 1) Newly required water testing revealed that the water supply in the St. Francis of Assisi Parish and School buildings has detectable levels of PFAs. Test results were received on July 31, 2024.
- 2) What are PFAS? PFAS are a group of human-made chemicals that have been used in a variety of products, including non-stick cookware, food packaging, upholstered furniture, clothing, and firefighting foam. They have been made and used in the United States since the 1940s. Perfluorooctanoic acid (PFOA) and perfluorooctane sulfonic acid (PFOS) have been the most extensively produced and studied of these chemicals.
- 3) Immediate steps were taken to address the situation including informing staff and parish leadership, speaking with appropriate authorities, and engaging a contractor to design a remediation plan.
- 4) At no time was the well water in the preschool used for consumption. The preschool already had protocols in place so that only bottled water was used for consumption. Regardless, all water fountains are turned off and bottled water will continue to be provided to students and staff while this issue is addressed. The water used throughout the campus is safe for washing. Appropriate signage will be posted as well.
- 5) We have engaged a contractor to design a remediation plan that meets state guidelines. The details and timeline of this plan will be shared as soon as possible. This process could take several months but we are underway.
- 6) It is my understanding that this problem with PFAS in our well water may be pervasive throughout wells in Weston.

The health and safety of our parish family is of utmost importance and our number one priority. We continue to work with the Connecticut Department of Public Health, the Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection, and the Aspetuck Health District on this issue and will update you as more information becomes available. We will be holding a town hall meeting on **Wednesday**, **September 04**, **2024 at 7:00pm in the parish hall** to discuss this matter further. In addition to the leadership from the parish, there will be members from the Connecticut Department of Public Health, Department of Energy and Environmental Protection and the operator from Foley's Pump Service be present to answer any questions you might have.

Thank you for your patience and understanding as we work to address this important issue.


