

Arrangements must be made at the rectory in person by the couple. Where possible, arrangements should be made one year in advance and no later than six months.


SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING

Ephphatha – Be Opened

Have you ever thought about how your life would change if you ever lost your hearing or your ability to speak?

One of the most beautiful prayers during our Catholic baptism rite is modeled after Jesus' healing of the man in today's Gospel. The priest or deacon touches the ears and the mouth of the child and prays, "The Lord Jesus made the deaf hear and the dumb speak. May he soon touch your ears to receive his word, and your mouth to proclaim his faith, to the praise and glory of God, the Father."

We are given our five senses so we might experience God's divine presence more fully and share what we have been given. The Gospel of John begins with, "the Word became flesh and dwelt among us." Jesus came in the flesh to open the ears of the deaf and the eyes of the blind and empower his apostles and us to do the same. Jesus tells us in John 14, "Truly, truly, I say to you, he who believes in me will also do the works that I do; and greater works than these will he do, because I go to the Father. Roland Faley writes, "the 'era' of grace' is more than a spiritual experience; it has physical results, as well." God wants us to be whole - body and soul.

Jesus personally came to heal our bodies, souls and those inner wounds that may be not be visible to the naked eye nor spoken aloud. Most importantly, he came to heal the sin-sick soul.

During the worldwide Synod on Synodality, one of the most impactful lessons that I learned was that listening to another person with one's heart is a means of building a bridge that can enable meaningful communication, a conveyance of God's love, and a means for miraculous inner healing and conversion. Hearing and truly listening are two different things. We might hear someone but not necessarily listen to them with our hearts. True listening touches another's soul as the divine life of Jesus enters into the dialogue.

When we are attentive to God's voice in Scripture, the power of God's love and mercy flow from the divine Word and takes root in our hearts, if we are humble...acknowledging that every truly, fulfilling action in our lives comes from God. Inspired by this confidence, we become Jesus' healing hands to restore all who might be physically or spiritually impaired for the greater glory of God.
