

Dear Parishioners,

During the initial two weeks of September, I embarked on a pilgrimage to Europe with a group of 50 individuals from various regions of the United States. Our journey took us through four distinct countries: Portugal, Spain, France, and Poland. Despite the persistent rain throughout our travels, the experience was truly remarkable. Among the numerous destinations we visited, Fatima and Lourdes left the most profound I impact on me. These locations held a special significance as I had never before set foot in

these sacred places. The candlelight processions at both sites were incredibly moving. Despite the rain, cold, and darkness, the glow of thousands of candles illuminated the faces of pilgrims from around the globe. The air was filled with the scent of wax as individuals recited the rosary in various languages. The vast square sparkled with candlelight as pilgrims knelt on the wet pavement in prayer. Following the rosary, the statues of Our Lady of Fatima (Portugal) or Our Lady of Lourdes (France) were carried outdoors around the shrine with a sea of people holding

candles aloft and singing hymns "Ave, Ave, Ave, Ave, Ave, Ave, "

Maria."



To have an opportunity to celebrate Mass at the Shrine where Mary appeared to Saint Bernadette in Lourdes was such a magnificent honor for me. Also, to observe the unwavering faith and devotion of pilgrims from diverse backgrounds and cultures was a powerful experience. It served as a reminder of the vast and unique nature of the universal Church. People from all over the world, from all walks of life, speaking different languages, pray ceaselessly 24 hours a day and 7 days a week for our well-being. My own faith is definitely strengthened after this pilgrimage.

When you come to encounter the places where Mary, Mother of Jesus appeared, you are never the same again as the Saints were. After their encounter with Mary, they lived a quiet life until their death.
