

Dear Friends in Christ,

Light the Advent candle one
Now the waiting has begun
We have started on our way
Time to think of Christmas Day.

Happy and blessed Advent! For many of us, Advent is one of the most favorite of all the liturgical seasons. It holds hope, promise, love, and all the things that we need to be at peace with ourselves and one another. Although this season is often lost because of all the emphasis on the retail and commercial preparations for Christmas, this Advent season calls us to quiet and provides us an opportunity to reflect on why our God chose to send His Son as our Savior. The lines in the passage from Jeremiah on this First Sunday remind us that "the days are coming, says the LORD, when I will fulfill the promise I made to the house of Israel and Judah…in those days Judah shall be safe and Jerusalem shall dwell secure; this is what they shall call her: The LORD our justice.""

There is no better time to hear these words than today when nations are at war with one another and persecution and suffering is inflicted on so many innocent people. That is not only about these international and political wars, it is also about the wars in our personal lives! This is from the love we are called to have for one another. The sober reminder in the concluding words of the Gospel remind us of the importance of taking this holy season seriously: "Be vigilant at all times and pray that you have the strength to escape the tribulations that are imminent and to stand before the Son of Man."

Are you ready to encounter the Lord? Are you ready to stand in judgment for your actions? Do you really understand the life that Jesus calls us to live? Are you ready? Use well these days of Advent to prepare yourself...do not put off until tomorrow what is important to get done today!

This holy season provides us with many opportunities to accomplish that...so stay awake and get busy doing the things that in the end really matter!

We offer many opportunities during the Season of Advent for you to come prepare yourself for the coming of the Savior during Christmas. Please the bulletin and newsletter for the Advent schedule and please make the commitment to take this time for yourself and renew your relationship with the Lord and the Church. Invite someone to join you and take the journey of faith together.

A pastor in Cimballa had strong doubts about the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. While presiding at Mass, the Host transformed into flesh and blood began to flow from it on to altar linens. The relic of the corporal soaked in blood can be seen today in the parish of Santa Maria.
