

The Baptism of the Lord

Today is one of my favorite feast days. One reason is the fact that the event of Jesus's baptism in the Jordan River by John the Baptist is so rich in meaning. Jesus is immersed in the waters symbolizing his mission of going deep into the darkness of our sins and rising by the light of his divinity to give us new life, free from original sin. It also inaugurates Jesus in his public ministry with the revelation of the Holy Trinity – Father, Son & Holy Spirit that are manifest in glory. The Son is obedient to the Father who loves and is pleased with his Son, Jesus, and their mutual love is poured out in the Person of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus had said that among men, there was none one greater than John the Baptist, yet John says that he is not worthy to "loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire." John is anticipating the fullness of baptism of the Holy Spirit that takes place at Pentecost.

John's baptism was a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. He baptized with water for repentance. Jesus will do something even greater. In addition to pouring out his life on the cross to forgive our sins, he will give us the gift of the Holy Spirit to further empower us to preach the Gospel, heal the sick and give new life to others in Christ. Our baptisms are the beginning of this journey of faith.

Jesus is going to pour out the Holy Spirit upon his people so that the Spirit itself will dwell within them. The Spirit will come upon them in tongues as of fire. And in that, the prophecy of Jeremiah 31 will be fulfilled, where God says, "I will write my law in their hearts," or in the words of Ezekiel, the prophet, "I will put a new heart and a new spirit within them."

The Gospel of Luke's account of the baptism of Jesus focuses on Jesus and the Holy Spirit and less on John's role as the one who pointed others to "the Lamb of God." By our baptisms we are all called to point others the Lamb of God by offering our lives in gratitude for the glory of God, as did John.

Jesus gives us our mission to follow in his footsteps: "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Teach them to carry out all that I have commanded you. And know that I am with you always even until the end of time."

We are grateful to all our families who have brought their children to be baptized at Saint Francis. I know that God is at work when a child excitedly cries out, "dada, dada," during the ceremony. They seem to know that Abba is their Father. It just doesn't get any better than starting someone on the path of a holy life in Christ!

Who do you and I know to whom we can invite to share the joy of baptism?


The Community Outreach Drives have been amazing this year, with so many families in need being touched by your kindness and generosity!
