

In lieu of my normal weekly letter, below is the obituary for Fr. Joe. Also in this bulletin are 3 pages of photos and reflections from parishioners as a memorial to him.

REV. JOSEPH A. SIDERA, C.S.C.

February 15, 1942 - January 12, 2025

NORWALK, CONN. – Rev. Joseph Anthony Sidera, C.S.C., 82, died at Norwalk Hospital in Norwalk, Conn. on Sunday, January 12, 2025 after a short illness.

Rev. Joseph A. Sidera, C.S.C. was born in New Haven, Conn. on February 15, 1942 to John and Theresa (DiBonis) Sidera and is one of three children. Fr. Sidera graduated from Notre Dame High School in West Haven, Conn. before entering the Holy Cross Seminary at Stonehill College in 1959. He spent his Novitiate year in Bennington, Vt. before making first vows on August 16, 1961. He made final vows in Holy Cross on August 16, 1964. He completed his undergraduate studies at Stonehill college, before earning a Masters of Theology from Holy Cross College in Washington, D.C. in 1968. On June 1st of that same year, he was ordained a Holy Cross priest at Stonehill College in Easton, Mass.

After ordination in 1968, Fr. Sidera was assigned to teach Theology at King's College in Wilkes-Barre, Pa. until 1973. In 1973, he began his advanced studies at the University of Notre Dame, earning a Masters in Counseling in 1974 and a Masters in Social Psychology in 1975. From 1975-1977, he was assigned as Director of Campus Ministry at King's College before returning to the University of Notre Dame to earn his Doctorate in Psychology in 1983. From 1983-1985, he returned to King's College to teach Psychology. From 1985-1987, he worked as a counselor for Catholic Social Services for the Diocese of Fall River, Mass. before being assigned to the Formation Staff at Moreau Seminary in Notre Dame, Ind. from 1988-1991. In 1991, he returned to King's College as the Director of the Counseling Center until 2003, when he became Program Director of Shalom Center in Splendora, Tex. until 2005. From 2005-2008, he was assigned as Vocation Director of the Eastern Province of the Congregation of Holy Cross. In 2008, he was appointed Parochial Vicar of Our Lady of the Assumption Parish in Fairfield, Conn. and served there until 2013, when he was assigned as Associate Pastor at Holy Infant Parish in Orange, Conn. until 2017. From 2017-2019, he was appointed Associate Pastor at Church of the Assumption in Woodbridge, Conn.

Beginning in 2019, he assisted at St. Francis of Assisi Parish in Weston, Conn. where he ministered until the time of his passing.

Preceding Fr. Sidera in death are his parents, sister Angela Marie Petrucci and foster-sister Corine Alfano.

A Memorial Mass will be held on Thursday, January 16, 2025 at 12:00 p.m. ET at St. Francis of Assisi Parish in Weston, Conn. Fr. Sidera's funeral will be held on Tuesday, January 21, 2025 at 3:30 p.m. ET at the Basilica of the Sacred Heart, Notre Dame, Ind. Burial will be in the Holy Cross Community Cemetery at Notre Dame, Ind. Harding Funeral Home in Westport, Conn. is in charge of the arrangements.

In a very short period of time, I have experienced the loss of two important father figures: my biological father and Father Joe. Father Joe was not just a roommate, but a mentor and spiritual guide. His passing has been particularly difficult for me as I am far away and was unable to visit him in the hospital. This loss is deeply felt within our parish community. His intelligence, humor, humility and presence will greatly be missed. We must continue to live out the legacy which he left behind and the things he taught us since Father Joe came to SFA.

My most cherished memory of Father Joe is when he would begin the mass by saying "Let us always remember we are in the presence of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit."





Fr. Joe presided at my father's funeral Mass. He didn't know my dad and I wondered what he would say. His homily referenced a poem by Henry Van Dyke, "Gone From My Sight". It filled me with such comfort and hope that I would one day see my father again. I will be forever grateful to Fr. Joe for this. I'm sure there are many happy souls now saying of Fr. Joe "here he comes".













I remember how Father Joe always personalized Holy Communion by saying your first name as he gave you the eucharist. It seemed to put emphasis on a one-on-one relationship with Jesus.

Father Joe was an avid outdoorsman who loved fishing. He truly was a fisher of people (men, women and children). My 12-year-old grandson attended some of Father's scripture studies for men on Saturday mornings. Now, it is our task to continue Father Joe's work — hook, line and sinker. Keep him in your prayers.

I loved hearing all of Father Joes stories about Squaw island Maine and other fishing adventures. He was filled with the Holy Spirit and helped me learn so much about my Faith. I'm going to miss you, Father Joe!











Every time I talked to Fr Joe or just listened to him, I came away inspired and committed to being a better Catholic. In his very gentle way, he moved me to know more, study more, pray more. His affect on my life has been profound. I am a better person because of him.

I will be forever grateful to have met Fr. Joe and will forever remember his wonderful lessons of theology, his love of life, and his fatherly friendship.
