

Arrangements must be made at the rectory in person by the couple. Where possible, arrangements should be made one year in advance and no later than six months.


SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING

The Presentation of the Lord

In our first reading, the prophet Malachi prophesies of the Lord coming to the temple and purifying the people thus allowing for pure and acceptable sacrifices to God. Our beautiful Gospel speaks of Mary and Joseph fulfilling the law of their faith by bringing Jesus, the perfect sacrifice, to the temple in Jerusalem to consecrate him to God, the Father. Jesus, by his baptism will be our source of purification and new life. Saint Luke, by quoting Simeon's prophecy, accentuates that Jesus is to be the source of salvation for "all peoples," not just every male, or a select few from one particular culture or a preferred religious status.

One of the most special offerings that we make to God, as a faith community of Saint Francis is when we offer our infant children to the Lord through the sacrament of baptism. As an integral part of the ceremony, the children receive a white garment to signify their dignity as children of God and our Lord's triumph over sin and death won by his resurrection. Parents and their extended family, which includes each of us, promise to teach the children to love God above all else, doing so by our words and example.

Another holy offering to the Lord is when we place our loved ones, who have died, into the hands of God. They, too, are covered with a white pall signifying that their life in Jesus *will* continue with that same dignity in God's heavenly kingdom.

One of the most beautiful expressions of love that I have ever seen was during Father Joe's memorial Mass when our young altar server brought the Missal to Father Mark for the opening prayer with tears of love mingled with sadness streaming down her face. It is by God's love that we are born, by his love that we live fruitful lives in communion with God and each other, and by his grace that we return to the Love from which we came.

Simeon with the child, Jesus, in his very arms praises God saying, "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my own eyes have seen your salvation which you have prepared in the sight of all the peoples: a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel."

Today, as we bring our very selves to God's dwelling, we are nourished by Jesus, who longs for us to hold him in our hearts. And just as Jesus was revealed to Simeon and Anna as the fulfillment of their and Israel's every desire, may we be deeply transformed by God's divine peace as we present our very lives to him.




