

Dear Friends in Christ,

In today's Gospel, Saint Luke gives us Jesus' first big sermon known as the Sermon on the Mount and is called the Beatitudes. It is shocking after you read through them one by one.

The topic of the Beatitudes is about blessings and happiness, but how can it be a blessing to grieve or to be poor or to weep or to be hated? They are in a total reversal of ordinary standards, Jesus links true happiness with struggle, hardship, suffering and opposition, not with the prosperity, popularity, and pleasure that we normally associate with happiness. So when we read about what Jesus is saying in the gospel, we need to read it with the eyes of faith, and it is with the eyes of faith that we can see the truth of what Jesus is saying. With the eyes of faith, we can see that Jesus is teaching a truth of life here. He is not just challenging the ways and values of the world. He is also showing how God blesses His people.

In the Beatitudes, Jesus did not say that the good things of life are evil - not at all. They are God's gifts and we are meant to enjoy them. But he is saying that they cannot satisfy our desire for happiness. And so, if we put our trust in them, as Jeremiah says in the first reading, our lives will wither and harden, like tumbleweeds in the desert. No roots, and no fruits. Rather, Jesus is teaching us that the true path to happiness in this fallen world is paved with life's challenges and hardships. It is like there is no rainbow without the rain, and there is no gain without the pain. These remind us that this world is passing and imperfect, that the only dependable thing in life is our friendship with God. Hardships and challenges teach us to root our lives in the rich soil of knowing, loving, and serving him; then our lives will be like a flourishing tree, with strong roots and delicious tasty fruits. This lesson has to be re-learned continually. Because of our fallen nature, we always tend to think we can find heaven on earth by putting together just the right combination of possessions, praise, and power. If we do this, we will fall into the enemy which is the devil's trap.

What Jesus tells us in the gospel today makes us look at the adversities and difficulties of life and look at them with the eyes of faith. And we want to believe that it is in the adversities and difficulties that God is going to rain down His blessings upon us. Because it is in our adversities and difficulties that we become the poor, the hungry, the weeping and the hated. It is the very people that Jesus said that God will bless and bless abundantly. God is there for them and will bless them because God knows that they have no one to turn to and nothing else to rely on.

In today's Second Reading Paul teaches us that a life without the Lord is ultimately a futile life, because a life with the Lord is a life redeemed and transformed by the Resurrection into a life of hope. True happiness is being with the Lord and trust in him. Happiness is not having something or becoming someone. The Beatitudes are like the ingredients for a happy life. When you read the lives of the saints, you will find that they lived their lives using with these ingredients. The closer the saints got themselves to Christ, the more they suffered. Their hardships made them cling more closely to Christ, their sacrifices won graces from God and now they are enjoying the reward which is true happiness forever in heaven. And we also know of people who faced adversity but saw opportunity, people who faced difficulty but were blessed with creativity. And when we face adversity and difficulty, let us not be in distress about it. Let us rejoice. Because it is then that God is blessing us abundantly.






