

Dear Friends in Christ,

This weekend, we celebrate the 8th Sunday in Ordinary Time as we get ready to start the holy season of Lent this Wednesday. We will not return to Ordinary Time again until the middle of June.

This Sunday, we hear a very challenging Gospel message, as Jesus tells us that we should notice the large wooden beam in our own eye before we notice and criticize the splinter in our neighbor's eye. Our Lord in today's Gospel reminds us that we must try to see and live clearly before helping others, or it will be a case of the blind leading the blind.

For example, we know that children learn more from what the elders do rather than what the elders say. If the children observe a contradiction in the elders between what they say and what they do, they become confused. If the children observe that their parents tell lie and if parents advise children not to say lies, they will have difficulty to accept the advice. That is why Jesus told his disciples that before giving correction to others one has to make an introspection to see whether the same mistake or weakness is within him/her. First I have to correct myself before I give correction to others and I have to practice what I preach. In management books it is termed as "walk the talk".

An ancient Greek philosopher named Aristotle believes that we learn to be moral or virtuous by modeling the behavior of moral people. Through continual modeling we become virtuous out of habit. Of course, people can learn both good and bad habits depending on the role models they have. Aristotle also believes that it was the moral duty of every citizen to act as a good role model. Through the Gospel passage for our reflection today Jesus wants to communicate to us the same message. As disciples of Jesus, we have a great responsibility to become role models of integrity and honesty both in words and actions.

St. Paul in his Letter to the Ephesians teaches us: "No foul language should come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for needed edification, that it may impart grace to those who hear" (4:29).

As we enter the Eighth Week in Ordinary Time, we should reflect upon the richness of the Wisdom of God that has been given to us through today's readings. We should ask ourselves,

- "Am I walking in the spirit as all children of God are called to do?"
- "Am I shining in the fruit of the Holy Spirit?"
- "When others hear my words or see my actions, do they recognize spiritual behaviors?"
- "Is my perishable body shining in the imperishability that it has received from God?"

If out of the abundance of our hearts flows all what is worthy of being a child of God, then we should rejoice. If we see flaws in what flows from our hearts, then let us ask the sanctifying Spirit of the Lord Jesus and through the Receiving of Holy Communion, to correct those flaws so we may shine in the world as Jesus shined during His days on earth.

May God be with all of you and your families and bless all of you throughout the season of Lent.

Seventh-grade students discussed the cardinal virtues and learned that these virtues serve as the cornerstone of ethical conduct: **Prudence, Justice, Fortitude, and Temperance**. These virtues are referred to as "cardinal," which means hinge, as they are the origin from which all other virtues emerge from, acting as a central hinge point for moral behavior. **Prudence** helps us recognize and choose between right and wrong, while **temperance** encourages self-discipline in decision making. **Fortitude** helps us have courage to face challenges, and **justice** helps us acknowledge what is fair and reasonable.

After analyzing the definition of the four cardinal virtues along with the 14 associated "sister virtues," students

were assigned a Bible passage for contemplation, focusing on whether these virtues were exemplified within the text. The Scriptural passage in which Peter denies knowing Jesus, found in Matthew 26:69-75 was assigned to Nick Cotronei and his group. Below is their poetic reflection:

Let's talk about my friend Peter
Whose habits couldn't be neater
He gave us some hope
And he became our first Pope
He really just wasn't a cheater
But there was a horrible time
When Peter committed a crime
This crime was a sin, not nice
He denied his knowledge of
Christ


