

Our Mission Statement: In the spirit of Saint Francis, to know Jesus and make Him known.

Dear brothers and sisters in the Lord,

This weekend we are saying our final farewell to Pope Francis who died on Easter Monday at the age of 88. Let us pray for the repose of the soul of our beloved Holy Father. He will long be remembered for his great compassion for the elderly, the sick, the unborn, the persecuted and all those on the margins of society. He continuously reminded us that we are the stewards of God's creation and not its master. And he was an unwavering champion of world peace. After a life dedicated to proclaiming the Good News of our Lord's saving love for us, may Pope Francis now inherit the reward of eternal rest with God.

Also over the next couple weeks, we will be inundated with news reports about "what's next for the Church?" Let's remember that the Church is both human and divine, and its divine charter and mission (to make disciples of every nation, baptizing them, and teaching them) can never and will never change - this is Christ's promise, that the gates of Hell will not prevail over His Bride, for which He gave up His life. So instead of speculating, let us also pray and fast for the upcoming conclave; trusting the Holy Spirit to guide the Church.

Divine Mercy Sunday: On the Second Sunday of Easter of the Jubilee Year 2000, at the Mass for the canonization of St Faustina Kowalska, Pope John Paul II proclaimed to the world that "from now on throughout the Church this Sunday will be called Divine Mercy Sunday."

Sister Faustina was a young, uneducated nun in a convent of the Congregation of Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in Poland. She came from a poor family that struggled during the years after WWI. She had only three years of formal education, so hers were the humblest tasks in the convent, usually working in the kitchen and the garden. Yet, Sister Faustina received extraordinary revelations from Jesus between 1931 and 1938. Jesus asked her to record these experiences in her notebook. The image of Divine Mercy that we have comes from these revelations.

We see Christ's divine mercy at work in today's Gospel, as Christ appears to the disciples as they are hiding in a locked room after his death and resurrection. I think of in this Jubilee Year, Cathedrals and Churches designate specific doors where pilgrims enter, symbolizing Jesus and the way to salvation and redemption, symbolizing Jesus as the door to which we enter our faith. However, we all have places in our hearts and in our lives where we lock the doors, whether they be bad memories we have, sinful habits or addictions we cannot leave behind, or vulnerable parts of our lives we are afraid to share. As we celebrate the mercy of God in a special way today on this second Sunday of the Easter season, we are reminded that the risen Christ does not wait for the doors to be unlocked in order to enter our lives. Rather, our of his love and mercy for us, he enters our locked rooms and transforms our fears into inner peace, just as he did with Thomas and the other disciples in today's Gospel. We are called to invite the risen Jesus into the locked places in our hearts and allow his Divine Mercy to bring Easter peace to our deepest fears.

A chalice with 351 Hosts was stolen by thieves in San Francesco's Church in Siena. They were returned in the alms box at the Church fully intact. Since 1730, the 351 Hosts remain fully intact without any deterioration, in defiance to physical and biological laws. Other non-consecrated Hosts start to decay within years of placing them in a sealed tin box. This miracle is celebrated each year.




Your gift to the Bishop's Appeal is more than just money. It provides hope.
