Reflection – 6th Sunday of Easter – Cycle C Acts 15: 1-2, 22-29; Revelation 21: 10-14, 22-23; John 1: 23-29

There will always be differences of opinion and often in life we think that our opinion is the right one, much like those in the early church. However, just as our Trinitarian God is one, we too, are called to be one and to work to bring all of God's flock to the one, true God. Father Roland Faley writes, "the Spirit of God is unifying and not divisive.

Our unity is grounded in the peace that the Spirit brings . . . the same peace that Jesus spoke of when he said, "my peace I give to you, my peace I leave with you." Jesus' words offer us a unique kind of peace, distinct from the kind that the world offers. Jesus' peace has an eternal quality and is intended to bring comfort and reassurance - especially in times of differences of opinion, suffering, confusion, or fear.

When we are resting in the peace of the Holy Spirit which we received sacramentally at baptism and confirmation, we experience a piece of heaven and recognize the gentle humility of Jesus which we aspire to emulate. Although one and the same essence as the Father, Jesus says to his Apostles that "the Father is greater than I." This statement shows us that in his humanity, Jesus is acting in humility by freely submitting to the will of the Father to fulfill the mission to reconcile all to God through his sacrifice of unconditional love. This supernatural reconciliation is meant to extend to our brothers and sisters in our journey of faith.

The late Pope Francis sought through the Synod on Synodality, not to change dogma, but to allow the Holy Spirit to participate in healthy dialogue with the Christian body as a whole allowing us to listen and learn from each other with the Spirit of wisdom, knowledge and understanding.

When we are filled with the divine peace of Christ we can listen to others with the heart of Jesus and seek respectful understanding of another's position, guided by the Holy Spirit who is one with the Father and the Son. ALOHA, (Ask – Listen – Observe – Help – Ask Again)


