A WORD FROM FR. JOHN...

As you peruse our bulletin this week, you will notice various items mentioning events and activities for Advent. We are not trying to rush the season, just inviting you to take advantage of some opportunities to grow in holiness and to enter into the spirit of the season as we prepare for the coming of Christ. These range from the spiritual: reflecting on the Sunday Scripture readings and a presentation by Sr. Barbara Moore on the Mystery of the Incarnation as part of Voices of Women; to the social: attending GEVA's presentation of "A Christmas Carol;" to the charitable: Next Step collection of warm hats, gloves and socks, and various Giving Trees; and to the socially responsible: Alternative Giving Fair. As the season approaches, more of these opportunities will be highlighted.

While we are the topic of holiday craft sales, again this year we are organizing volunteers to assist with welcoming guests who visit St. Boniface Church during the large craft and locally produced goods show and sale in the South Wedge on Saturday, December 1, 11:00AM-4:00PM. Last year, some forty volunteers assisted throughout the day, as we invited the crowds of passers-by to tour our church, listen to sacred music, learn about our parish and meet some of our wonderful parishioners. This was very well received. We are enhancing what we did by putting together a guide to explain the history and many beautiful features of the church. We also are pleased to announce the re-establishment of the St. Mary's Tithing Fund Committee, which is an effort to provide funding to non-profit groups doing good work in our parish neighborhood and surrounding area. For more information see the article on page 4 of this bulletin.

Those of you who have visited Blessed Sacrament in the last week or so may have noticed steam welling up near our parish offices in the old rectory. Unfortunately, we have experienced a leak in the steam line that supplies heat generated from the boiler in the school. I am working with our parish staff and Finance Council, in consultation with various experts and vendors to determine the most cost efficient and expeditious solution. Our parish encompasses twelve aging buildings that produce their share of challenges – some larger like this one, others less so, like the failing hardware on the doors of two of churches. Yet, I am confident that with your support and the expertise and advice available to us, we will be able to overcome these in good order.

We are continuing to make progress in reaching our Catholic Ministries Appeal goals in all three of our churches. I am truly grateful to those who already have made a contribution and whose names are listed in the flyer enclosed in this bulletin. I would invite the rest of us to join them in making a sacrificial contribution whether large or small to help us reach our goal by Thanksgiving.

RENEWING AND REFRESHING ADULT FAITH Grief and the Holidays

The holiday season is approaching. Every year the anticipation of Christmas is celebrated in our Church and in secular society. Advent liturgies, with their familiar music and readings, prepare us for Jesus' coming. All around us decorations, scents, and sounds get us "in the mood" for the holidays.

The holiday spirit for most [many] of us, however, does not bring pure joy. Feelings are often complicated by memories of special persons who have died. We remember past Thanksgivings and Christmases and grieve those loved ones who are not with us this year.

During the season leading up to Thanksgiving and Christmas, it is good for us to remember what we know by faith: that our loved ones who have died, although not with us physically, do live on in eternity. Our relationships with them do not have to end. We can maintain our bonds with them... what researcher William Worden has called "relocating the deceased" in one's life.

Have you seen the movie "Coco"? It is a beautiful portrayal of these bonds, the story of a young child who visits his loved ones in the afterlife on the "Día de los Muertos," Day of the Dead... a feast celebrated in Mexico this month.

This holiday season, let's consider focusing on our loved ones' presence by inviting them to be with us at family celebrations or at our own private celebrations... in whatever special ways that are significant to them and to us. In this way we will unite ourselves to them in the communion of saints, and, together with them, to God, with whom they now abide.

RE-ESTABLISHING ST. MARY'S TITHING FUND COMMITTEE

Over the last several months, a group of parishioners have engaged in the exciting task of envisioning how St. Mary's can responsibly provide stewardship over the \$200,000.00 in funds that were given in a bequest from the estate of Patricia Dwyer with the expressed purpose of meeting the significant needs within our parish boundaries. The committee, comprised of Fr. John Loncle, Deacon David Palma, John Horvath - St. Mary's Finance Council, Jessica Wojick - Chairperson, Christine Kvam - Secretary, John Myers -Member and David Wikiera - Member, along with Rick McGrath -Member at Large, reviewed the mission and structure of the Tithing Committee that was once active at St. Mary's and under Fr. John's guidance, have re-established this important ministry within the parish. The Tithing Fund Committee has determined that the best use of this generous endowment would be to draw primarily on the interest of the invested funds for annual disbursement to organizations, ministries and agencies. Initially drawing only on the interest from this gift will allow for St. Mary's to be meaningfully engaged in the Gospel call to care for those in need and the Catholic imperative to seek social justice for many years to come without impacting the parish budget. If, at some point in the future, the Finance Council determines that it is fiscally responsible for the parish to contribute to the tithing fund, this would be welcomed additional revenue.

Now that the committee has re-established its charter (see the parish website) and outlined its processes and procedures, it is ready and eager to begin accepting applications for funding consideration. The committee is seeking applications from local non-profit agencies who are in need of funding to continue their work of providing for basic human needs, supporting prevention or intervention services to address social problems, or providing self-sustaining initiatives. Applications will be reviewed and funds will be disbursed quarterly with the first application deadline on December 31, 2018. We look forward to strengthening the relationships we have already built with several local ministries through this giving, and eagerly anticipate learning about and supporting new organizations which make a positive impact in our neighborhoods. Applications for funding are available by contacting Deacon David Palma or via the parish website.

The Tithing Fund Committee will provide the parish with quarterly updates on the recipients of our tithing funds and the good work they do building up the Kingdom of God right here in Rochester. It is with heartfelt gratitude that we thank the family of Patricia Dwyer who with her generous gift to the parish, has allowed for this ministry to be re-established, so St. Mary's can continue to meet the call to serve others.
