





A WORD FROM FR. JOHN...

Today is the Fourth Sunday of Lent, **Laetare Sunday**, which takes its name from the Latin word, *Laetare*, which means rejoice and begins the entrance antiphon (introit) at Mass. As the penitential character of the Lenten season is relaxed today, we rejoice as we look with expectation to the joyful celebration of Easter, for which we have been preparing ourselves through prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Anticipating the joy of Easter, which is just three weeks away, we are given a boost of hope and encouragement as we make our way towards the great Paschal Feast.

In some ways, it is akin to experiencing those delightful days that burst forth with sunshine and warmth, after enduring our prolonged gloomy, cold and snowy Rochester winters. While those days signal the coming of spring, often they do not last, as we are plunged back into winter's grip. It may be tempting to see in that the unrelenting power and persistence of winter, instead of the desperate and dying grasps of a season that is coming to an end. Having grown up in Rochester, I know better than to expect the full arrival of Spring anytime soon. Yet, I rejoice in the taste of better things to come as the increased light and warmth of those days give me hope and encouragement as I await fullness of Spring. May this Laetere Sunday afford us that same hope and encouragement as we continue our Lenten journey.

While we are on the subject, I invite you to consider engaging in a little spring cleaning of your closets, garages, attics, basements and storage spaces in anticipation of our parish's Next-To-New Sale. We welcome your donations at Blessed Sacrament school, starting on Saturday, April 13 of Palm Sunday weekend and running through Thursday, April 25 (Weekdays 10-7; Weekends: 10-4; Closed Easter Sunday, April 21) In addition to the generous donations of your "treasures," we welcome the generous donation of your time, whether just a few hours on one day or many hours over several days. Many opportunities to volunteer are available and waiting from Set-Up on Friday, April 12, through Sorting, Organizing and Pricing, to the actual Sale on May 2, 3 & 4, and the Tear-Down on Saturday afternoon, May 4. Please look for the Volunteer Form in next week's bulletin for details. This is our largest parish fundraiser and a key source of revenue. In addition, it is a crucial source of a vast array of inexpensive goods for those on fixed budgets or of limited means, as well as those who just love a great bargain.

We are continuing our **All Parish Book Discussions** of Matthew Kelly's book, The Biggest Lie in the History of Christianity, after the 4:00PM Saturday and 10:30AM Sunday Masses at St. Mary's this weekend. Our three discussions last weekend yielded some useful feedback and suggestions. I hope that you will be able to join us as we continue the process this weekend and next.

Lastly, I would like to remind you that next weekend, April 6 & 7, we will join other parishes in a diocesan-led effort called **Sharing Our Blessings** to encourage donations to the Catholic Ministries Appeal. As part of this in-pew solicitation effort, we will be taking up a second collection with numerous ways to contribute as we seek to meet our parish goals. In addition to a straight cash donation, we welcome donations by check. Cash and checks can be directed in three ways (1) placed in the second collection or made out to the Catholic Ministries Appeal; (2) placed in a marked envelope or made out to the parish church with "anonymous" in the memo line, in which case the amount will be forwarded to the CMA without your name attached; or (3) placed in a marked envelope or made out to the parish church with "shortfall" in the memo line, in which case, the parish will use the funds to make up any shortfall as of May 31, 2019, for which the parish will be billed by the diocese. Unused "shortfall" funds will remain with the parish church to cover our needs. A new option is also available to "text" your CMA gift to the diocese with the use of a cell phone and credit card. This "text-to-give" option is explained in the enclosed insert in today's bulletin. On the opposite side of that insert are a list of reasons to consider a donation to the CMA. Our parish needs the help of everyone giving what they can, large or small, to help us meet our goals. I thank all the donors who have brought us a long way to reaching our goals. With the help of several more donors, we will be able to significantly close the remaining gap, putting this behind us so that we can focus more of our time, energy and resources on the pressing needs of our parish. Thank you, in advance, for your support of this effort.

RENEWING AND REFRESHING ADULT FAITH

Reflections on Matthew Kelly's book The Biggest Lie in the History of Christianity.

As someone who is an avid reader, I've had many books which I have skipped through to the end. Matthew Kelly's book, *The Biggest Lie in the History of Christianity*, was not one of those books.

Although written in a simple, basic manner, it got me thinking about such things as Holy Moments: when had I experienced them, and becoming more aware of them. One Holy Moment occurred on November 13, 2018. On that date Sr. Mary Sullivan, RSM, spoke at the Women of Peace program given by Mercy Spirituality Center in memory of my late mother. Sr. Mary Sullivan's talk was so inspiring that I made a donation to the Mercy Focus on Haiti as a thank you.

Besides reading the book, I was asked to lead a reflection group. At the last session the group came up with a Lenten proposal. One member had been to St. Martin and Haiti and was concerned about the conditions in Haiti. The group decided we would spend our Lent focusing on Haiti. I contacted a Mercy sister who goes to Haiti twice a year with a medical team. She said a need they have is for coloring books for children whose families are receiving medical treatment. Our Lent is now focused on collecting coloring books for Haitian children. I never thought such a small act, like collecting coloring books, could become such a Holy Moment.

RETURN OF THE PRODIGAL 2019

This year in our Lenten readings we will hear the story of the Prodigal Son. Four decades ago one of the parishioners at St. Mary's created a large batik after being inspired by this story. This year it is hung again at St. Mary's, and we also used the image on our Lenten prayer card. Here is her story.

Just a couple of weeks before making the batik hanging of "The Return of the Prodigal", I had done a pencil drawing of the returning son at a distance, the father in the foreground with arms outstretched, a long winding road between them. It was a gift that just before beginning it, the prodigal child had arrived in the arms of the one who loves unconditionally.

As I look back, it seems there was a semi-conscious process of grasping the heart of this Gospel story over several years. When finally making the time to put it on fabric with wax and dyes, there was an immediacy unlike most of the work I find myself making. I have been grateful to hear stories of how this image has touched lives over these past 39 years, and recognize that I was not alone in creating it.

In conveying both the parent and the child with no specific gender I had hoped we might be able to recognize ourselves in each of them. After several years it struck me that we might be both persons simultaneously, forgiving, accepting, and embracing ourselves as well as those others in our lives.


