



#### A WORD FROM FR. JOHN...

After exploring our options and talking with those in another parish who already use the software program we ended up selecting, we are in the process of changing how we will schedule and coordinate our liturgical ministers (i.e. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion; Lectors/Lay Leaders/Commentators; Altar Servers; Cross and Candle Bearers; Greeters; Sacristans and Mass Coordinators) at all three of our churches. We will be using the software program, Ministry Scheduler Pro (MSP), to create the liturgical ministers' schedules for January-March 2020. In the next several weeks, current ministers will be receiving an email inviting them to log in to their account online and submit information needed to prepare the next schedule. Those without internet access will be asked to contact the parish office to submit their preferences and availability. Based on the information that ministers submit concerning their preferences and availability, the software program will generate a schedule. We will use MSP's Emailer feature to send ministers their personalized schedule and print copies for those without internet access. The program also will allow us to send automatic email message reminders. And it allows ministers to easily find their own subs by submitting a request online that alerts other available and qualified ministers to the option of volunteering to take their place. Before the next schedule is generated, ministers will have the opportunity to update their profile, and adjust their preferences and availability. I ask for the patience and cooperation of our ministers as we make this transition. As we become more and more familiar with the various features, I anticipate that we will grow to like the benefits and options that it provides.

As Thanksgiving is less than three weeks away, I wanted to highlight a change in location. After several years of holding the Mass at St. Boniface, this year we will be celebrating our Thanksgiving Day Mass at St. Mary's Church at 9:30am. As part of the celebration, we are inviting folks to bring a non-perishable food donation for the emergency food cupboard administered by our Supper Program at Blessed Sacrament. A list of request items will appear in our bulletin in the coming weeks. This is a great way to express our solidarity and share some of our bounty with those in need, giving thanks to God for the many gifts and blessings that God showers upon us. Also, as part of our celebration, we are

inviting those who wish to bring food or other items (e.g. candles) to be blessed that then they will take home with them for use in their own celebrations of this wonderful feast. I hope that many of you will be able to join us for what proves to be a delightful and joyful Eucharistic celebration of Thanksgiving.

Continuing the theme of giving thanks, I am grateful to all those who have contributed to the Catholic Ministries Appeal. As of this past Tuesday. November 5th, we have made some good progress towards reaching our parish goals, thanks to the generosity of our initial donors. Just 14 donors have given \$11,125.00 or 16.2% of the \$68,823.00 goal at Blessed Sacrament. Ten donors have given \$2,915.00 or 11.1% of the \$26,322.00 goal at St. Boniface. And twelve donors have given \$2,885.00 or 5.9% of the \$49,313.00 goal at St. Mary's. The diocese indicates that donations are starting to pick up as past donors are making use of the pledge forms that they only recently received from the diocese in the mail. If you did not receive a pledge form in the mail, forms are available in each of our churches and donations may be made online by going the diocesan homepage (www.dor.org) and clicking on the "Make a Donation" button on the CMA banner. While there, you can watch the CMA video and learn more about the ministries and programs supported by your contributions. I am most appreciative of those who have made a donation in this challenging time for our Church. And I encourage those who are still discerning to continue to pray and ask for God's guidance.

Lastly, some quick highlights of upcoming opportunities in our parish: Nominations of high school seniors for the Hands of Christ award are due to Sr. Kathleen by Monday, November 18th; We are looking for a few more volunteers to assist with upcoming coffee hours at Blessed Sacrament, St. Boniface (Saturday evenings), and St. Mary's: The Downtown Community Forum on Wednesday. November 20 will cover a number of projects affecting our neighborhood (see below); and Don't miss the next Voices of Women presentation by Mary Lou Coffey on Mary of Nazareth from her birth to her standing at the foot of the cross on Good Friday to be held on Sunday, November 24, at noon at St. Mary's.

#### RENEWING AND REFRESHING ADULT FAITH

#### A Saint who Inspires Me

"If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me" (Matthew 16;24). The life of Saint Isaac Jogues demonstrates what it means to take up your cross and follow Christ. Called to a holy life from at a young age in France, Isaac confided to his priest his desire to pursue missionary work in Africa. "No, my son," his priest replied prophetically: "You will die in Canada."

Undeterred, Isaac joined Jesuit missionaries in America among the Huron people. Arriving to what is now upstate New York, Isaac described the landscape as unimaginably beautiful. I find myself inspired to worship when observing the beauty of the very same landscape.

Isaac was captured by a rival tribe to the Huron. He was ceremoniously tortured, losing both his index fingers and thumbs. Despite immense suffering, Isaac continued to minister to his fellow captives and baptize converts. When Dutch Protestants heard of Isaac's capture, they arranged for his rescue. Isaac escaped while the Dutch distracted his captors under the guise of a trading rendezvous. I pray for the same love amongst all followers of Christ that Isaac's rescuers demonstrated.

Isaac was granted special permission from the Pope to distribute communion, even though communion was only to be distributed with the index finger and thumb. This reminds us that the sacraments are more than a strict set of rules and procedures; they are an outward reflection of our inner love for Christ.

Isaac returned to preach to the people who had tortured him, where he was eventually martyred. This dogmatic commitment invokes Christ's teaching: "He who sets to the plow and turns back is not fit for the kingdom of heaven."

I pray to have the courage of Saint Isaac in the missionary work God has laid before me in my life.


#### MARY OF NAZARETH
