





## A Word From Father John...

In this column last week, I shared various thoughts about what we are calling "A Simple Lent." If you have not yet had an opportunity, I would encourage you to read it. It will help you to understand better the journey that we are inviting you to take this Lent.

Before I outline a number of resources that we are making available to you today and some initial Lenten activities, I want to offer one more reflection on "A Simple Lent". Again drawing from scripture, this notion of "A Simple Lent" not only relates to the story of Jesus' temptation in the desert wilderness, which we will hear proclaimed on the First Sunday of Lent, but also to the story of Jesus' passion and crucifixion that we hear proclaimed at the end of Lent on Palm Sunday and during the Sacred Triduum on Good Friday. As we consider the process of simplifying and emptying that we are encouraging all of us to undertake this Lent, we can look to Jesus on the cross, the Crucified Christ, as a rich image for reflection. Gazing upon Jesus hanging on the cross, we see that he is stripped of everything—literally naked (only notions of propriety and decency have encouraged artists to supply a loin cloth). Bound and nailed to the cross, Jesus also is stripped of his freedom. Through his passion leading up to his crucifixion, he has remained largely silent and made himself small and humble, as he is falsely accused and physically and verbally abused. Betrayed and abandoned by his closest followers (with the exception of the women and John, who stand at the foot of the cross), Jesus has been handed over to those who seek to entrap him and take his life. They also attempt to strip him of his dignity through mockery and abuse. And finally alone on the cross, he expresses that all too human feeling in the face of suffering and death of being abandoned by his Father God.

Reflecting on the Crucified Christ, Paul notes that such an image was viewed as scandal for the Jews and foolishness to the Gentiles. Yet, for us Christians, who are freed of such ways of thinking, gazing upon Jesus stripped of everything as he hung on the cross, we are invited to see everything. For in light of the Resurrection, we see in the Crucified Christ the revelation of the fullness of God's love, mercy and forgiveness that leads to salvation and life.

This weekend, we are offered a number of resources to help us enter into "A Simple Lent." First, there is the Parish Lent Reflection Booklet, which offers a short reflection by members of our parish on the readings for Mass each day from Ash Wednesday through Easter Sunday. This resource was well received last year, so we are happy to offer it again. Second, stuffed into every copy of the bulletin, along with additional copies to take, is a two-sided flyer highlighting the schedule of liturgies from Ash Wednesday, through the season of Lent, Palm Sunday, the Sacred Triduum and Easter Sunday, along with opportunities to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation and information about Fasting and Abstinence. Third, we are offered a wallet-sized card that we can have with us throughout Lent that gives us a quick summary of "A Simple Lent," along with suggestions of how to put that into practice in our lives. In addition to slipping it into our purse, wallet or pocket, we might place a copy on our mirror, computer screen, refrigerator, car dash, or wherever it may prompt us to pause and engage in the process of simplifying and emptying. Fourth, we may choose to pick up the Catholic Relief Services (CRS) Operation Rice Bowl materials that offer us suggestions about how we can employ prayer, fasting and almsgiving to learn about and support their charitable and inspired work. It is our plan to have additional copies available through at least the first several weeks of Lent, for those who might be away this week or who might need another copy or two.

Also available this weekend are copies of Examinations of Conscience for Adults, Youth and Children, along with a flyer encouraging all of us to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation and reminding us of the various steps in that process. I have no interest in creating any barriers to enabling all of us to participate in this wonderful outpouring of God's love, mercy and forgiveness through this sacrament. Part of the reason that we are offering them this weekend is that we are offering expanded times for individual confession next Saturday and Sunday afternoon and Monday evening, March 5-7. The times and locations are listed in this bulletin as well as on the flyer inserted in this bulletin. As we have done in the past, two priests will be available to hear confessions at each time.

Lastly, a listing of our Ash Wednesday liturgies, both Masses and services, is on the front of the bulletin and on the flyer inserted in the bulletin. Ashes will be distributed at all six of these liturgies. Based on guidance from the diocese, we will return to applying ashes to the forehead in the sign of the cross.

As we spring into the season of Lent, may our efforts to observe "A Simple Lent" plant seeds that bear abundant fruit in the season of Easter and beyond.
