


charity and social justice. A deacon gives witness to his availability to the community by addressing present and emerging needs of the Church. The Diocese is inviting interested men of strong and active faith, who can demonstrate a record of service in the communities in which they live, work and worship, who may wish to explore a possible call to ordained ministry as a permanent deacon, to first speak with their pastor for an initial conversation. They may also contact Deacon Edward Giblin, Director of the o f the Permanent Diaconate. edward.giblin@dor.org, for additional information. potential candidate must be at least 35 years of age and no older than 62 years of age at the time of ordination after a five (5) year period of formation. He must be in good health, emotionally mature, have stable relationships and must have the wholehearted support of his wife (if married) and family to enter the phase of inquiry. Because the parish is the primary experience of Church for most inquirers, the parish community is asked as well to invite from among its members men who exhibit strong faith and a spirit of service and encourage them to consider a possible vocation to the permanent diaconate.

A Word From Father John...

We are entering a period of transition in our parish, as we say good-bye to Fr. Mike and prepare to welcome Fr. John Omboga as our new parochial vicar. Change is never easy. As often happens, we grow accustomed to someone and come to rely on them being a stable presence in our lives. This can be all the more the case with priestly ministry, as a priest often journeys with us through key moments in our life's journey. These can include difficult and challenging times, especially those involving significant loss, as well as joyous and celebratory times, like baptisms and marriages.

From my own experience, this can be equally challenging for a priest, especially serving in the role of parochial vicar, as the average stay in an assignment is often around three years. It is not uncommon that one just gets comfortable in an assignment and with the community of people one serves, only then to be asked to move on to a new assignment. Yet, that shouldn't surprise us as the one we follow tells us today in our gospel that answering his call can place significant demands upon us and disrupt our life and our own plans. As Jesus says about himself and the nature of the mission that God has sent him to accomplish, unlike animals that have homes, he as the Son of Man has nowhere to rest his head. Instead, he journeys from place to place, not aimlessly, but with an ultimate destination in mind. And yet, along the way, he may not always receive a warm welcome and a place to find shelter and rest. As we move onto a new assignment, we thus can find some reassurance and encouragement in recalling the final words of Jesus in our gospel today, "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God," (Luke 9:62).

While we are encouraged not to look back as we need to stay focused on those whom we are serving in our new assignment, certainly pausing for a moment to exchange good-byes and say thank you become grace-filled moments that aide us in our departure and as we set out on the way. I hope that many of you are able to join Fr. Mike for his Good-Bye and Thank You gathering after the 12:00 Noon Mass at Blessed Sacrament this weekend. I trust that many of you who can't attend will find a way to thank him and wish him well as he leaves us and begins his new assignment at St. Marianne Cope Parish in Rush and Henrietta on Tuesday, June 28.

On the same day that Fr. Mike leaves, Fr. John Omboga will move into the rectory at St. Mary's. After a day to start settling in, he will preside at his first scheduled Mass in our parish at 12:10pm on Thursday at St. Mary's. And then with Fr. Ed away next weekend, Fr. John will end up presiding at each of our Masses across the first two weekends in July. I trust that you will offer him the same warm welcome that you have shown me and the other priests who serve our parish. As I mentioned before, while Fr. John is coming to us from his home diocese in Kenya, he has been in our diocese before, studying at St. John Fisher College and serving at Our Lady of the Lakes Catholic Community in Penn Yan, Dundee, Naples, Prattsburgh, Rushville, and Stanley. So, he has some familiarity with our area and diocese. But it may take some time to reacclimate and reorient himself. My sense is that you will remain patient and supportive as he does so.

Please keep Fr. Mike, Fr. John Omboga and all those affected by new assignments in your prayers as they undergo these significant transitions. May God bless them with the grace and love that they need and open their hearts to the new ministerial opportunities that come their way.

Before I close, a few important points. Don't forget that next weekend, the Saturday 3:30pm confessions and 4:30pm Mass will switch back to St. Mary's for July through December. While I anticipated at the start of the project that the parking lot behind the rectory at St. Mary's would be completed by now, we unfortunately ran into a few issues that required a modification of the plans that led to delays. Hopefully, we can get back on track and finish the work in short order. Also, a number of panels have been removed from the transept stained glass windows at St. Mary's for repairs, they will be back in about two months. So, don't believe the rumors that I sold them to pay for the parking lot repairs.

Peace and blessings to everyone as we transition to the changes that this summer will bring to each of our lives, both those that come each summer and those which are new to us this year.




Children ages 4 through grade 5 are welcome to this time of games, crafts, snacks, friends and fun!
