

# A Word From Father John...



Our Gospel today begins with Jesus making an awe-inspiring statement about what it means to be his disciples: "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him," (John 14:23). The first part talks about how we reveal ourselves to be disciples of Jesus Christ. First, as his disciple, our relationship with Jesus is grounded in love. As we learned from Jesus's encounter with Peter, that love is the love of friends, for whom there is no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friends. Second, that love of Jesus leads a disciple to keep his word. This builds on our tendency to take to heart the words of

our friends, whether criticism or compliments. In the case of a disciple, we cling to the word of the Lord such that it becomes a part of us—who we are and what we do. In this regard, a Franciscan priest taught me a prayer that he would say as he marked the sign of the cross on his forehead, lips and over his heart just before the Gospel is proclaimed at Mass: "May the Word of God be on my mind, on my lips, and rest gently in my heart." That prayer captures beautifully how we are to keep the word of the Lord.

The second part talks of how our loving Jesus and keeping his word opens us to experience God the Father's love and the indwelling of God the Father and the Son. While God loves us first and always, our loving friendship with Jesus, who is both human and divine, is the means by which we enter into the love shared between the Father and the Son. That love overflows to become its own coequal Person, the Holy Spirit, who comes to reside in us through baptism. As baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, we are destined to share in his divinity through that same Holy Spirit, who overshadowed Mary in the Incarnation - God becoming a human being like us—and who entered more powerfully into Jesus at his baptism - inspiring and empowering him to reveal the Word of God in his words and actions. In much the same way, in today's Gospel, Jesus indicates that the Father sends us the Holy Spirit to teach us everything and remind us of all that Jesus told us. Thus, the Holy Spirit helps us to love Jesus and to keep the word of the Lord.

At the same time, being brought into the loving communion of the three divine persons imparts the peace that Jesus gives us. As Jesus indicates this peace is not the worldly peace based on treaties, deal making or posturing, and equated with the absence of war and conflict. This divine peace is a wholeness that only God can provide. It will not prevent our having to endure trial and persecution or guarantee our good health and success. Instead, it is an assurance that whatever evil we may encounter has been overcome already in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. As such, this peace is an unbreakable bond between us and the Triune God, which will guide us along the way to our heavenly home. When trial and persecution, ill health and failure inevitably come, we recall Jesus's reassuring words, "Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid." He has warned us ahead of time, so that when it happens we can believe that the Holy Spirit dwells within us guiding us and granting us peace.

Hopefully, coming to understand and appreciate Jesus's awe-inspiring words in today's Gospel will help us amid the uncertainty and polarization that presently challenge us. And may they spur us to respond by living into our loving friendship with Jesus and taking to heart his word, so as to experience the love of God in the indwelling of the Holy Spirit and gift of God's peace.

May our celebrations this Memorial Day weekend be filled with the Easter gifts of love, joy and peace.
