








Celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi Blessed Sacrament Church Sunday, June 22

A Word From Father John...



"Come, Holy Spirit, come!" is the opening line of the Pentecost Sequence. It also is a fitting prayer for us today and each day of our lives. Yet, our relationship with the Holy Spirit is a challenging one. Unlike Jesus, who became a human being like us, the Holy Spirit is depicted as breath, wind, and fire. While each is evocative of the Holy Spirit as the life force of God, we are left with more of a sense, feeling, or impression than a tangible reality. As such, our relationship flows from our perception of the Holy Spirit acting upon us and through us.

Yet, even given the ephemeral nature of the Holy Spirit, we cannot overlook the concrete ways that the Holy Spirit fills us with life and impels us to go forth in mission. At different points in our own lives, we may suffer setbacks and tragedies that snuff out our zest for life, much like the death of Jesus left his disciples feeling alone, weak and despondent. In those moments, the Holy Spirit may not descend upon us in the form of a thundering whirlwind and tongues of fire. Yet, we would be mistaken to think that means that we are left alone by ourselves and unperturbed. For the Lord sends us the Holy Spirit to be our Paraclete, who stands along side us as our comforter and advocate. The Holy Spirit is not there to just teach us and remind us of everything that Jesus told us. Instead, the Holy Spirit comes to dwelling within us, as the breath of life, that draws us into oneness with Christ and animates us to live the life we have in Christ. Thus, we are profoundly transformed from a sense of being alone to being all one with God in Christ through the Holy Spirit.

In the Gospel according to John, coming and standing in the midst of his fearful disciples, the risen Jesus says "Peace be with you" and breathes the Holy Spirit on them. Gripped by fear arising from a sense of shame and guilt at having denied and abandoned Jesus, the power of the Holy Spirit imparts pardon and peace that bubbles up in joy as the disciples see that the Lord has not abandoned them. Having been healed of their terrifying woundedness, they receive the gift of Holy Spirit that inspires and empowers them to receive and give forgiveness. In a divided and polarized world, where recrimination and revenge loom large, the power of forgiveness allows us to clear the air, so that all of us together can breathe in the peace and joy that we long for and that our one God, living and true, seeks to share with us. Sin and death leave us feeling alone. Through his death and resurrection, Jesus atoned for our sins and overcame death, and most significantly unleashed the life giving force of God through the gift of the Holy Spirit. As the Holy Spirit comes to dwell within us, we are reconciled with God, and our very way of being is profoundly transformed. As such, we are impelled by that same Holy Spirit to go forth on a mission of reconciliation as instruments of God's healing and forgiveness. As we do so, the Holy Spirit brings us together as one with God filled with the peace, joy and love of Christ.

May the coming of the Holy Spirit bring peace and reconciliation to our families, Church, nation, and world. Yours,

Please consider switching to Online Giving

At the 9:30am Mass last Sunday, Mike Burns, the Chair of the Finance Council at Blessed Sacrament, made an appeal for folks to consider switching to Online Giving. Mike pointed out that during the summer, many of us enjoy well-deserved vacation time out of town. Yet, even while we are away, the parish's need for our financial support continues. So, he reminded us of the option to participate in Online Giving. Sign up is easy and is available by going to southeastrochestercatholics.org, clicking on the "Ways You Can Give" button below the "Bulletins" button on the homepage, or clicking on "About" on the menu bar at the top of the page and selecting "Ways You Can Give" from the drop down menu. Either way, you are taken to the "Ways You Can Give" page. Just scroll down the page, select "Online Giving for Blessed Sacrament (or St. Boniface or St. Mary's)" and complete the steps that follow. The system allows you to make your financial contribution in the amount and at the frequency that works for you. If your circumstances change, you can go back and make adjustments accordingly. An updated flyer is available in church this week to assist you with signing up (The pastor offers a "mea culpa" for failing to check to be sure the previous flyer available in church was correct. He apologizes to anyone who was led astray).

In the spirit of friendly competitiveness, Mike issued a challenge to the folks at Blessed Sacrament to increase the number of those enrolled in Online Giving from 33%, so as to surpass the 43% who give online at St. Mary's. We are alerting everyone in all three churches, lest the folks at St. Mary's be caught off guard and surpassed, and giving the folks at St. Boniface the opportunity to jump ahead of the other two.

Joining Mike, we thank all of you for your financial support of our parish. Your generosity fuels almost all of what we do as a parish. It not only funds our many ministries and the staff who oversee and coordinate them, but also keeps the lights on in church, pays for heating in the winter and cooling in the summer, and routine maintenance and repairs to our facilities.
