



Natural Cleaning Products Waiting behind those Cupboard Doors...

Below are some helpful tips on ways to use natural organic products to assist in our daily cleaning routines as we continue to care for creation by eliminating harmful toxic cleaning agents:

- ♦ Distilled White Vinegar with Water, 1:1 ratio in a spray bottle disinfects surfaces.
- Hydrogen Peroxide mixed 50/50 with water in a spray bottle, disinfects.
- Hydrogen Peroxide mixed with baking soda for a paste, placed over fruit/veggie/wine stains on clothing. Let sit, reapply.
- Vinegar/baking soda used alternately, can fizz and foam away stubborn drain clogs. Used together will scrub away grime and soap scum.
- ♦ Lemon slices submerged in water baked in 250° oven for 20-30 minutes release grime inside the oven.

 Leave overnight, oven off, for stubborn cases. Finish stubborn spots with 1/2 lemon filled with salt.

Always spot test to avoid surface damage. NEVER add these products to bleach or bleach products or ammonia to avoid toxicity.

A Word From Father John...

As I indicated in last week's bulletin, due to the declining availability of deacons, we need to recruit and train more Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC) in August to start serving in September at our weekend Masses. Deacon Ed Knauf was reassigned to St. Patrick's in Victor earlier this year. Deacon David Palma is approaching retirement age and will share his plans in this column soon. That will leave us with just Deacon Duncan Harris on a regular basis. However, his other responsibilities as a full-time pastoral minister prevent him from being able to serve at every weekend Mass. Therefore, we will need EMHCs to help the priests distribute communion at the weekend

Masses, starting in September when a deacon is not scheduled.

To prepare for this eventuality, I will be offering training and review sessions for all those interested in serving as EMHCs right after the 4:30, 8:00 and 9:30 Masses on Saturday and Sunday, August 16th and 17th, and after the 11:15am Mass on Sunday, August 24th. I anticipate these sessions to take approximately 20-30 minutes of your time. I encourage those who are interested, regardless of prior experience as an EMHC, to attend one of these sessions. If you are interested in serving but unable to attend one of these sessions, please send me an email expressing your interest. Based on the need, I may offer additional sessions at a later date. Serving as an EMHC is a graced opportunity to grow closer to the Lord by participating in a unique and privileged way in the highpoint of the Eucharistic celebration. We must

I understand that many of you have served as EMHCs for a several years before the COVID-19 pandemic. I trust that you have not forgotten your prior training and service. However, it is beneficial for everyone, even those with prior experience, to review the expectations and procedures and have an opportunity to ask questions and express concerns.

Since the COVID pandemic, when we stopped regularly scheduling individuals to serve as EMHCs, several previously trained EMHCs have graciously stepped forward to fill in when a deacon was not available. I also appreciate those who have come forward to serve at Blessed Sacrament, as the size of the congregation necessitated additional EMHCs. I thank you for your willingness to help out frequently on short notice.

I want to inform everyone interested in serving as an EMHC that you will be asked to complete the diocesan-mandated Creating A Safe Environment (CASE) training, background check, and volunteer code of conduct, if you have not already done so. This is not because we suspect that you are unfit, but because we need all the good people to help us create a safe environment for everyone. As the Diocese, its parishes and affiliated organizations are expected to exit the bankruptcy-reorganization process shortly (hopefully), we continue to assume collective responsibility to assure that everything is being done to prevent abuse, especially of children, youth and vulnerable adults, now and into the future. The more of us who are trained to spot potential problems and proactively address them, the safer it will be for our children, youth and vulnerable adults, as well as those who minister to and with them. Knowing and consistently adhering to safe practices is the best way to safeguard others and protect against false accusations, while also creating a context in which we can focus on our God given mission and ministry.
