



#### From the Deacon's Desk...



Dear Companions on the Journey,

I have some important news to share with you. I am retiring from active diaconal ministry. Since my ordination 35 years ago, I have known this moment would arrive; and yet, now that it is here, it is more difficult to process than I anticipated. In September I will turn 75 and my current ministerial agreement with the Southeast Rochester Catholic Community

will end on August 31. After a time of discernment, reflection, prayer and a recent dose of reality (a health issue), I petitioned Bishop Matano asking him to grant me Senior Status. He has granted my request and as of September 1, I will be a Senior Deacon officially retired from active ministry.

These years of diaconal ministry have been a tremendous blessing in my life. When I was ordained, I could never have imagined where the Holy Spirit would lead. From rural farms to the inner city; from campus ministry to diocesan ministry; from parish staff to parish leader; it has been a most amazing journey. A journey shared by so many wonderful companions. A journey filled with great joy along with some sadness. I hope and pray that I have adequately loved and served the communities I was assigned to throughout these years.

At this moment in my life, it is important for me to acknowledge my beautiful bride Julianne who did not live to share this part of the journey. She was with me from the beginning and offered her constant support and encouragement. She was truly an equal partner throughout formation and diaconal service. Although I was the one ordained, without her love, good counsel, infinite patience, calming wisdom, ministry engagement, and yes, homily critiques (I still hear voice when I prepare), these 35 years would not have been possible.

Some of you might ask, "What happens now?" At this point I can honestly say – I don't know. I am taking six months off to reflect on the possibilities. Many of you have heard me say over the years that the Holy Spirit is the great travel agent of life. When I started this journey with an interview 40 years ago, this moment seemed so far off. Now that it is here, I realize the Holy Spirit is never done with us. Leaving active ministry is yet another step on my journey. Even as I cope with the challenges of aging and health issues, I know that the Holy Spirit is leading me somewhere I cannot imagine at this moment. However things turn out, I am at peace.

I thank you all from the bottom of my heart for all your love, support and kindness throughout the years. I wish you all many blessings on your own journeys. You will always be in my prayers, please keep me in yours.
