Religion We are celebrating the month of the Rosary. This month is dedicated to Mary, the patroness of the Immaculate Conception Church and the Rosary. The children will be learning the stories behind the events of the Joyful, Sorrowful, Glorious and Luminous Mysteries.

Math The children usually have homework 3-4 times a week. The homework is listed on Google Classroom under the subject area in Stream. However, homework is not given on Fridays. An "H" is circled and written at the top of the page to indicate the homework that night. The children are encouraged to be organized and place the homework into their folder each night. This month's concepts are: Count and Compare Numbers 0 to 5. In this chapter, students will use the terms greater than, less than or equal to compare numbers. In Chapter 4, students will count and write numbers 6 to 10.
