Ordinary Time: Encountering Christ in the Routine of Everyday Life.

This Sunday, we may notice a few changes in the liturgy. Father's vestments have gone from white to green, the extra decorations in the church have been taken down, and the mass seems to be simplified as opposed to the Easter Season. This is because the Easter season ended a few weeks ago when we celebrated Pentecost and the season of Ordinary Time began. (We just haven't seen the changes until now because the last two Sundays have been special solemnities.)

What's the difference in seasons? The Church calendar begins every year in December with the Season of Advent which focuses on the time before Christ's birth at Christmas. We celebrate the season of Christmas for 8 days, then move into the first part of Ordinary Time which represents Jesus's life from His birth until He began His ministry, a period we don't know much about. Then, after Mardi Gras, we enter the Season of Lent which focuses on Jesus's ministry leading up to Holy Week when we celebrate His passion, death, and resurrection. Lent ends on Holy Thursday and the Easter Season begins at the Easter Vigil and lasts until Pentecost. This period symbolizes the time Jesus remained on earth after the resurrection until His ascension into Heaven before the Holy Spirit came to the apostles 9 days later, which is what Pentecost celebrates. And now, for the rest of the liturgical year, we enter Ordinary Time which is when we focus on our lives in Christ.

Why the different seasons? As Christians, we spend our lives contemplating the *Paschal Mystery* which refers to Jesus's life, death, and resurrection. We try to follow His example and imitate Him in all those stages. Jesus's sacrifice on Calvary was not a one-time event that we just remember every year, but an eternal sacrifice which we are invited to enter into more deeply every year as we grow in our capacity to know and love God and each other. While there were the big days, like Christmas, His baptism, and Easter in Jesus's life, there were also those mundane events as he worked as a carpenter and went fishing with His friends. Similarly, there are big days in our lives, some joyful and other sorrowful. Then, most of our lives are mundane and routine, filled with chores, work, and the normal ups and downs of life. Unfortunately, special occasions are often the only time we look to God. Ordinary times remind us that our faith is not just for special occasions. God walks with us on the best and worst of days as well as on every day in between.

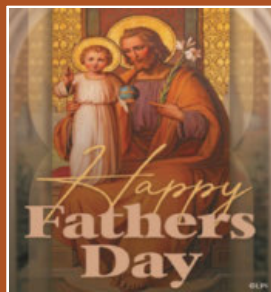

Something to Draw: Draw a picture of yourself helping a friend who got lost.

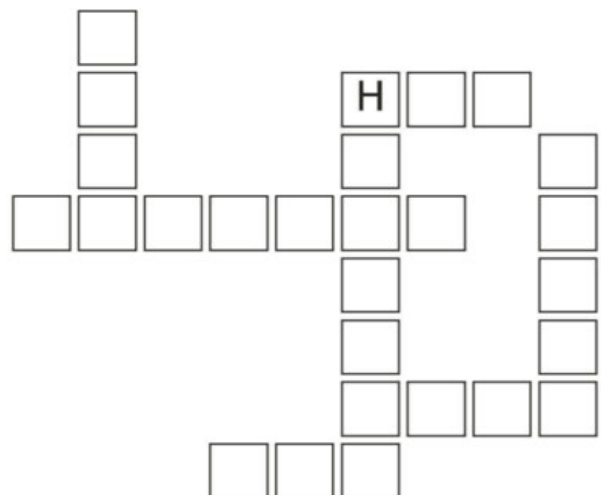

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Question: I've noticed that when I go to Mass at different parishes, sometimes people say and do different things. Why is that?

Answer: The Mass in its current form has taken shape over the course of 2,000 years. Over time, traditions, structures, and prayers have been put into place. There are certain rubrics for the Mass that are normative wherever you go. This means you could attend Mass in Malawi or Thailand or Italy and still watch the same basic liturgy unfold, even if you don't understand the language. There may be some cultural differences from place to place, things that aren't specifically listed. For example, in the United States most people go up for Communion in a nice neat line. In Europe, everyone gets up around the same time. It's a bit of a free-for-all! Some people might take it upon themselves to change things individually. People may not like something that feels too "liberal" or "conservative," and they may take a well-meaning stance in the opposite direction. When people (including the presiders) do things that are distracting or change the liturgy, it introduces an element that breaks the unity of the assembled community. The important thing to remember is that we gather as the Body of Christ to celebrate the Eucharist. If you are confused, ask! If you are frustrated, pray for the spirit of charity.

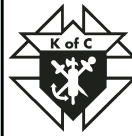

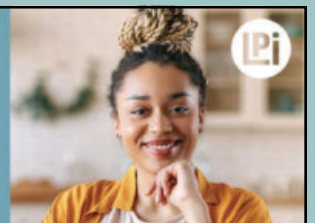
