DID YOU KNOW...

Why the Vestments?

One of the things about Catholicism that intrigues people is the use of the robes or vestments by ordained ministers during the liturgy. The reason they wear the vestments is that they serve as symbols to call to mind the sacred duty the ministers have in the liturgy. Today, I'll just focus on the vestments the priest wears. One point of continuity between the Old and New Testaments is that the priest is set apart from everyone else for a specific purpose, to offer the sacrifice to God on behalf of the people and to lead them in worship. In the Old Testament, the Levites were the priestly tribe and were set apart from society for this purpose. When they offered the sacrifices in the temple, they were to adorn themselves with specific vestments to recall the importance of the duty they were performing. As Christianity began to grow, the Church developed the use of vestments to serve as symbols to help recall the importance of the sacrifice of Holy Mass. In doing this, the Church both followed the precedent of the Old Testament and built upon what was useful in the ancient Greek and Roman cultures which used vestments for officials who performed civil and religious duties on behalf of society. Different styles have been used over the centuries depending on the various cultures, most of which are still in use today. In Africa, for example, vestments are often decorated with a special pattern reserved for royalty, yet another way to symbolize the reality the vestments point to. When vesting, most priests start with an amice, which is a white, towel-like garment that that they put over their shoulders and tie around their waste. It serves to protect the other vestments from being soiled by sweat, but also aids the priest in recalling the spiritual warfare he enters when celebrating the sacraments. When he puts it on, he prays for protection against diabolical attacks, likening the amice to a sort of helmet like a soldier would wear in combat. The next vestment is the alb which is the long white garment. The alb calls to mind the priest's baptism and his call to purity. When putting it on, he prays for the grace to act upon the grace of his baptism which enables him to embrace purity. Next is the cinture, which is a rope that serves as belt. When he puts it on, he, calling to mind again the spiritual combat, prays for the grace to gird himself in purity as he goes into battle. Next is the stole, which is a scarf-like garment that goes around his shoulders. The stole symbolizes the priest's rank and the duty specific to it. Since the priest's duty is to offer the sacrifice of Mass, he prays for the grace to worthily enter into Christ's eternal sacrifice which isn't bound by space and time but transcends it as it unites us to Christ. Finally, the outer garment is called the chasuble which symbolizes charity. It serves as a reminder that all the virtues are cloaked in charity and so to is the duty of the priest. When donning it, he prays for the gift of charity and the grace to exercise all his duties in it. Vestments, like all the other symbols the Church uses are there, not because God needs them, but because we do. People have always used symbols to point to greater realities which we often can't adequately express in words. There is NO greater reality than what happens at Mass and words can never a dequately describe it. And so, in our preparation for Mass, we should maybe consider meditating on the various vestments worn by the celebrant and pray with him that all he asks for while donning them be given to him so that he can do his duty well at the altar.
