



Over the years I have wasted a lot: a lot of money, a lot of time, and a lot of talent. Sometimes I didn't realize I was wasting these things but, after reflection, I realized I could have done more and accomplished much greater things. The Liturgy of the Word

The mass is divided into two parts: The Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The Liturgy of the Word begins with the Sign of the Cross and ends with the Prayers of the Faithful after the homily. As I've mentioned before, the purpose of the liturgy is to worship God, but the way it is designed is for *our* benefit. The Liturgy of the Word is what prepares us for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. So, let's break the Liturgy of the Word apart a bit.

Once the opening hymn is over, the celebrant begins with the Sign of the Cross, greets the faithful, and then invites us to examine our conscious and call to mind our own sins, both against God and each other in what is called the Penitential Act. The priest then invites us to ask for forgiveness before moving forward. This is because our Blessed Lord wants us to be in an appropriate state of mind as we prepare to encounter Him. (This removes venial sins but does not get rid of the need to go to confession, especially for mortal sins. We should still frequent the Sacrament of Reconciliation!) After the general absolution, we sing the Gloria, which is a hymn of praise. This is followed by the Collect, or opening prayer which introduces the specific celebration or occasion for the mass. Then, we get into the readings.

On Sundays and other special solemnities, there is a first reading, usually from the Old Testament, a responsorial psalm which is taken from the psalms, a second reading which can be from the New Testament, and the Gospel. (On weekdays, there is only the first reading and the psalm.) During the Gospel, we stand because we are either hearing from Jesus directly or an account of a story that directly involves His time on earth. This is also why whomever proclaims the gospel must be ordained either as a priest or deacon.

Following the gospel, the homily is preached by an ordained cleric. The homily should be on the readings and the gospel just read and is meant to be a teaching moment. While there are different styles of preaching, hopefully the homilist preaches in a way that provides context to the readings just read, an explanation of the spiritual implications and lessons in the narratives, and a challenge pertaining to how we can deepen our faith and better conform our lives to Christ in light of what we have just read.

Finally, we offer the Prayers of the Faithful whereby we unite our prayer as a faith community, recognizing that we are a part of *Church universal* which is much bigger than ourselves. So, at minimum, the intentions should include the Pope and all bishops, world civil leaders, any local needs, (protection from hurricanes,) the sick, the deceased, anyone, or anything for whom or for which the mass is being offered, and for personal intentions.

In short, the Liturgy of the word calls to mind that we as a people are striving to live our faith, while carrying our burdens and anxieties. That is why in it, we acknowledge our own failings, ask for forgiveness, seek Divine guidance by listening to and reflecting on the readings, take counsel by listening to the homily, and bring it all to the foot of the cross with the petitions we present. So, let's strive to truly enter into the Liturgy of the Word and so prepare ourselves to participate more fully in the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE: It's not uncommon to hear people complain that we Catholics often fail in communicating our faith. Fair enough. We can and should improve there. But it's interesting to notice that Jesus himself was implicitly accused by his disciples of a similar failure. This week in Matthew's gospel they are perplexed that he speaks to the crowds in ambiguous parables. The Lord's riddles leave many people more confused than before. He responds by pointing out that his parables have an intentional dual purpose: to hide (for some) and to reveal (for others) his Gospel: "Because knowledge of the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven has been granted to you, but to them it has not been granted" (Matthew 13:11). Is Jesus being unnecessarily difficult, obscurantist, or, worse, elitist?

No. We have to remember that all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge lie hidden in him (c.f., Col. 2:3). He is the word of God from heaven to be planted in the earth of our humanity to bear great fruit. However, like a lover delicately pursuing his beloved, we're dealing with a relationship, not new data. When we aren't willing to personally accept Jesus into our lives, the "info" of the Gospel will simply not make sense to us. It'll seem bizarre, esoteric, or like incoherent religious-speak. But when we are willing to accept Jesus into our lives, everything else starts to make sense. When others don't understand the Church or the Lord, let's be patient. Love is patient. Sometimes it has to hide before it is revealed.
