

My wife is a big Dave Ramsey fan. She loves when he tells people that in order to pay down their debt they need to sell so many of their possessions that the kids think that even they can be sold for the right price. He definitely sees earthly possessions as simply tools to be used and not "possessed." This is a tough, countercultural message for sure in the eyes of the average American. Too often, our self-worth is derived from our wealth and the items we own. The size of our house, the brand of our car, and the quantity of our belongings are all gauges of success in our world. For Ramsey, not only can you not truly own anything if you owe money to others, it belongs to God anyway and is only given to us as stewards.

Could you sell all you have right now? Could you walk away from all that you have amassed and be truly free? When Jesus speaks of the merchant who sells all he has to obtain a pearl of great price, he calls us to see the pearl as the kingdom of heaven. Nothing on earth can rival the value of the kingdom. If that is true, why is it so hard to surrender everything to God to obtain it? It can be fear that keeps us from stepping out in faith. It can be selfishness that prevents us from letting go. Whatever it is, we must face the fact that we are "possessed" by it. The good news is that God does not expect us to conquer this obstacle on our own. But with God, all things are possible.

#### Liturgy of the Eucharist Part 2

Last week, we left off at the "Holy, Holy," which is when the entire church comes together. The next thing that we enter is the Eucharistic Prayer. There are four main options for the Eucharistic Prayer that the celebrant can choose from. Father David typically uses Eucharistic Prayer three on Sunday, and two on weekdays as is his preference. The Eucharistic Prayer is prayed by the priest who is acting in the person of Christ. The language in the prayer is addressed to God the Father. Generally, the structure of the prayer begins addressing God the Father and blessing Him and then calls to mind what God has done for us in the past and what He continues to do for us now.

Next, the priest calls down the Holy Spirit upon the gifts and prays that they become the body and blood of Jesus. This is known as the consecration. This is when the celebrant extends his hands over the gifts, and makes the Sign of the Cross over them, and the bells ring the first time. Next, the celebrant prays the Institution Narrative whereby he uses Christ's own words, "THIS IS MY BODY...... THIS IS MY BLOOD WHICH IS GIVEN FOR YOU.....DO THIS IN MEMORY OF ME. The bells ring when he lifts the host and when he lifts the chalice. This is to get our attention and invite us to adore the Lord Himself. By using Christ's words, the priest personally participates in His eternal sacrifice. The priest also, in a sense, renews his own vows at this point in that he offers himself to God and His people anew at every Mass. Next, we proclaim the "Mystery of Faith." That is because what we encounter at every Mass is a mystery. That Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist is, for us, inconceivable without the eyes of faith. Thus, we are not called to completely understand or to solve the mystery, but to accept and embrace the mystery itself which God clarifies for us gradually according to the disposition of our hearts as we grow in the capacity to love. Next, the priest petitions God to nourish and heal all gathered, including those not physically present. He acknowledges the angels and saints, the dead, the Pope, the Bishop, and all gathered to call to mind the reality we discussed last week regarding the presence of the entire church. Finally, the Eucharistic Prayer ends with the final doxology, "Through Him, and with Him, and In Him..." which is when the priest draws all prayers and all people into Christ's eternal sacrifice to God the Father.

Next, we recite the "Our Father" as Jesus told us. Then, we make our peace with God and with each other. This is why the priest offers us Christ's peace, then bids us offer that same peace to each other. We shouldn't come to the altar with bitterness in our hearts. Finally, we acknowledge our own unworthiness to receive our Blessed Lord AND reaffirm our faith in his mercy *in spite of ourselves* with the words of the centurion, "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." When invited to, we then approach the altar to receive the Eucharist as we respond to Christ's loving initiative by physically and spiritually allowing our Lord to meet us where we are, with all our brokenness and burdens, just as He did over 2,000 years ago.

# GOSPEL REFLECTION

Our culture seems more polarized and divided than ever. Into this wounded situation, our Catholic faith has a healing remedy to offer: the gift of wisdom. When the Lord offers to give King Solomon anything the monarch desires, he requests "an understanding heart" (1 Kings 3:9). In his polarized situation, the King doesn't ask for power to defeat his enemies. He asks for a wise and understanding heart to judge right from wrong. This wisdom is elevated and fulfilled in Jesus who teaches us to bring forth "both the new and the old" (Matthew 13:52).

In our fractured society, we Christians should stop pining for political power to crush our perceived enemies. That often just makes things worse. Rather, it's much more useful to beg for the grace of true wisdom which transcends both sides of the aisle. This places us in a fresh position from which we can help our culture see what is true and good all across the ideological spectrum. Sometimes we'll look like liberals (e.g., in our love for the poor and marginalized) and other times like conservatives (e.g., in our sexual ethics and views on religious freedom). Because this wisdom is free from ideological narrowness, it will help to heal these painful fractures. Lord Jesus, this week, pour into us your healing wisdom.
