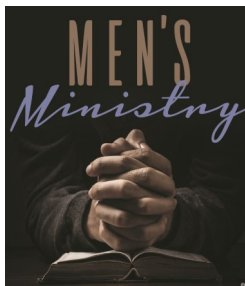

I recently watched the film adaptation of "Godspell" with my teenage daughter. I had such fond memories of watching it when I was young, back in the day. I listened to the soundtrack so many times and learned to play many of the songs on my guitar. The exclamation from the show, "You are the light of the world!" has always been firmly planted in my mind.

After about ten minutes, my daughter looked at me with that look only a teenage girl can display. "What is this?" she asked with a certain level of condescension. Yes, the film did not hold up so well in the eyes of the twenty-first-century critic. So we laughed most of the way through it.

Good stewards must never shy away from living lives that truly bear witness to the reality of the Gospel. The parables of Jesus have as much meaning for us today as ever. Look around. The world we live in needs a little light for sure.

Get your family ready for Lent

PREPARE YOUR HEART, MIND, AND CALENDAR:

Prepare your mind for the big game of Lent like you would for any test or competition.

Prepare your heart by praying to be open to the Holy Spirit and trust he will guide you from there.

Allocate time for Lent—for the extras and the usual things. Pray that it will be a way for you to use different opportunities to bless the time you spend running around, working, etc.

ACCEPT YOUR FAILURES:

Remember that Lent is not about you or your plans. Remember, you can't do it all. Embrace the "failures" – the interrupted prayer time, that you can't make your family go to the Way of the Cross or pray the rosary.

OPEN YOURSELF UP TO GOD'S GRACE:

Make the list and choose to cooperate with the things you don't like to do as well as the things you like to do.

SET THE TONE WITH MUSIC:

Update your playlist with Lenten music. Listen to the Benedictines of Mary, Queen of Apostles and Lent at Ephesus.

INVOLVE YOUR KIDS:

Create activities that your children can participate in. For example, pray one decade of the rosary a day, have a family Lenten penance, learn a new prayer.

A Lifetime of Missioning

Bill & Joan Grieggs have missioned to Our Lady of the Americas Missionary Foundation in Sotuta, Yucatan since the 1970's. Over the years, they have helped build schools, a house for lay ministers, purchase a building for missionaries to mission from, provided Catholic CD's and other tools to teach the Gospel and Sacraments as well as repair homes, and send clothes and food. For a 10 years, many mission trips were made to Sotuta. Bill, Joan, and other adults from St. Joan of Arc were able to take high school students from SCC. They worked with the Director of Seminarians at that time, Rev. Gregory Aymond, when he took Seminarians on trips as well.

You, the parishioners of St. Joan of Arc are a big part of this mission. A portion of the monies raised by our St. Joseph's Altar is sent to the mission each year. Many have donated clothes, other items and financial support for the mission.

Today, the Grieggs do not feel it is safe for them to travel to the Yucatan, however, they continue to mission to the people of Sotuta through monetary donations, spiritual support, and prayers to continue the mission.

AT REST IN CHRIST

My dear parishioners,

This Sunday we continue reading from the Sermon on the Mount—Matthew 5–7 chapters. Ordinary Time is meant to give us the teachings of Jesus Christ as it is communicated to us in the Gospel. This year we are reading from the Gospel of Matthew. Probably most people would think that with one reading during the Mass, that should be sufficient to try to digest during the Mass. We now have actually four readings to deal with: first, psalm, second and gospel. When this reading cycle was introduced after the Second Vatican Council, the idea was to expose the community to more Bible, and this was seen as a positive thing. Maybe Vatican II had a too optimistic idea of the human person, since most of us need a lot of time even to fully benefit from a single line of Holy Scripture. Today that line from the Gospel would be: "You are the light of the world." Let us take to heart that line and meditate on whether we are really being a light to others and to our world.

For adults: What do you think Jesus was thinking when he called us to be the Light of the World?

For parents with children: During one of these winter nights, take your children to a dark room in the house, and light a candle before you say a prayer with them. Then teach them what a difference that simple candle light makes and teach them that they can also make such a difference with others when they are the Light that Jesus wants us to be.

What does the Catholic Church say about Lent?

Lent is a 40-day season of spiritual preparation for Easter, mirroring Jesus' 40 days in the desert, focusing on prayer, fasting, and almsgiving (charity) for inner conversion, starting on Ash Wednesday and ending before the Easter Triduum begins on Holy Thursday evening, with specific rules for abstinence from meat on Ash Wednesday and Fridays. It's a time for self-discipline, deepening faith, and turning back to God through practices like scripture reading, attending Stations of the Cross, and acts of charity.

Key Aspects of Lent:

Duration: 40 days (excluding Sundays, which celebrate the Resurrection) from Ash Wednesday to Holy Thursday.

Purpose:

To prepare for Easter, commemorate Christ's sacrifice, and foster spiritual growth.

Core Practices (The Three Pillars):

Prayer: Deeper scripture study, more frequent prayer, and adoration.

Fasting: Self-control, often giving up luxuries (tech, sweets) and focusing on spiritual needs.

Almsgiving: Sharing time, talents, and resources with the needy.

Fasting & Abstinence Rules (for US Catholics):

Abstinence from Meat: Required for everyone 14 and older on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays during Lent.

Fasting (one full meal, two smaller meals): Required for ages 18-59 on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Significance:

A period of penance, purification, and renewal, echoing Jesus' time in the wilderness, to strengthen one's relationship with God before Easter.

Lenten Practices:

Receiving ashes on Ash Wednesday.

Attending Mass more frequently, especially the Stations of the Cross.

Participating in the Sacrament of Penance (Confession).
Giving up something (e.g., coffee, social media) to create space for God.

Lent is a deeply spiritual season for Catholics, prompting reflection and change to better follow Christ's journey to the Cross and Resurrection.

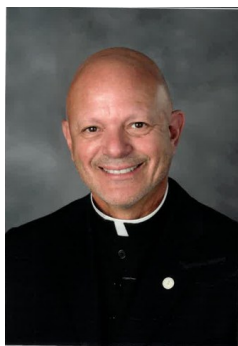


Mis queridos feligreses,

Este domingo seguimos leyendo del Sermón de la Montaña—Mateo capítulos 5 al 7. El Tiempo Ordinario nos comunica las enseñanzas de Jesús que se encuentran en el Evangelio. Este año leemos del Evangelio de San Mateo. Probablemente la mayoría de la gente debe pensar que con una sola lectura en la Misa tendríamos suficiente para digerir. Sin embargo, tenemos cuatro lecturas en la Misa del domingo: primera, salmo, segunda, y evangelio. Cuando se introdujo el nuevo ciclo de lecturas en el Concilio Vaticano II, la idea era exponer a la comunidad a mas pasajes de la Biblia, y esto se veía como algo positivo. Quizás el Concilio Vaticano II tenía una idea muy optimista de la persona humana, ya que la mayoría de nosotros necesitamos mucho tiempo para beneficiarnos de un simple versículo de la Sagrada Escritura. Ese versículo en el evangelio de hoy pudiera ser: “Ustedes son la Luz del mundo.” Tomemos en serio esa frase de Jesús y meditemos si realmente estamos siendo luz para otros y para nuestro mundo.

Para adultos: ¿Qué piensas que Jesús estaba pensando cuando nos llamó a ser Luz del Mundo?

Para familias con niños: Durante una de estas noches frías del invierno, lleva a tus hijos a un cuarto oscuro y enciende una vela antes de rezar con ellos. Entonces enséñales la diferencia que una pequeña vela hace, y como ellos pueden también hacer una gran diferencia cuando son la Luz que Jesús quiere que sean.

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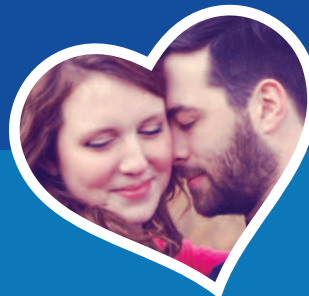


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
