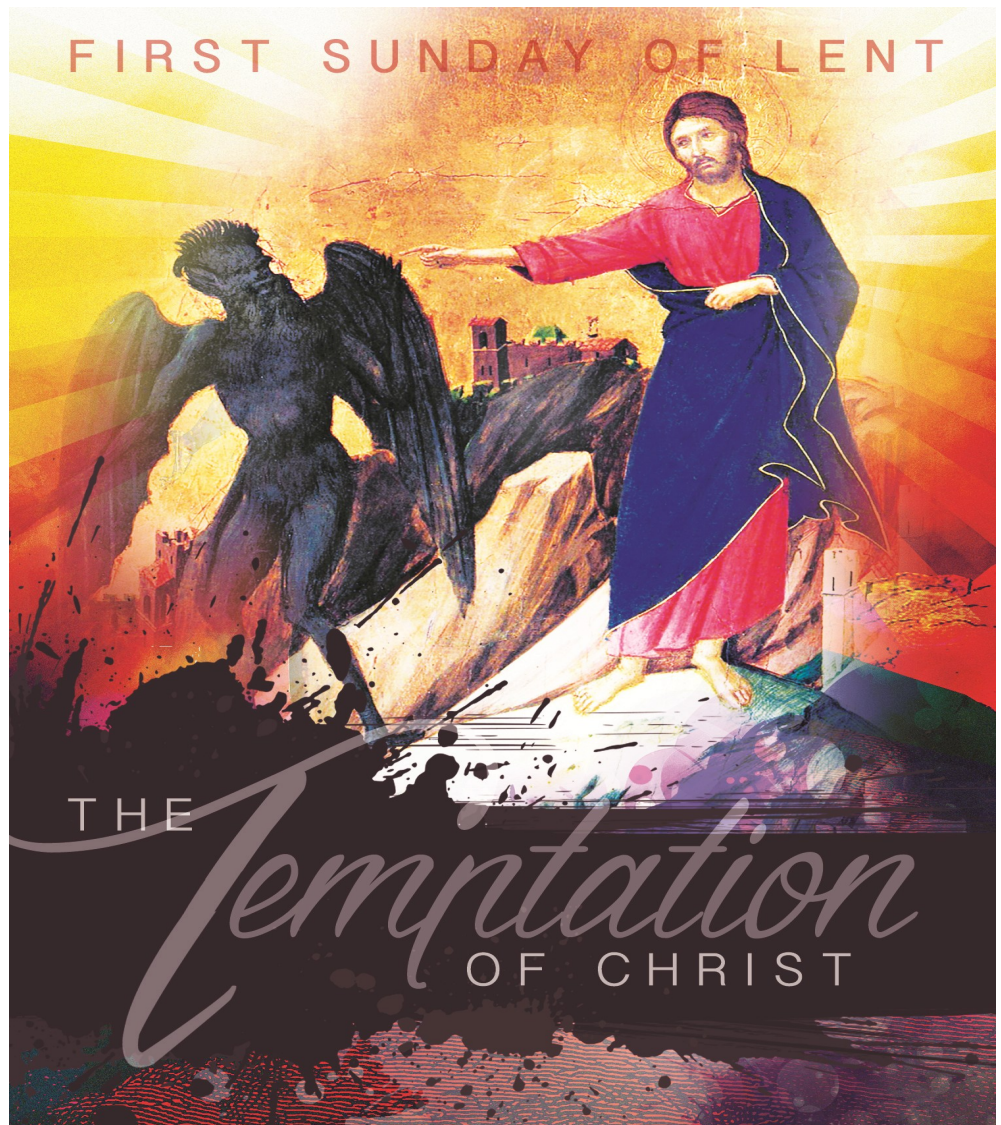

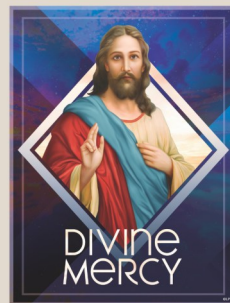

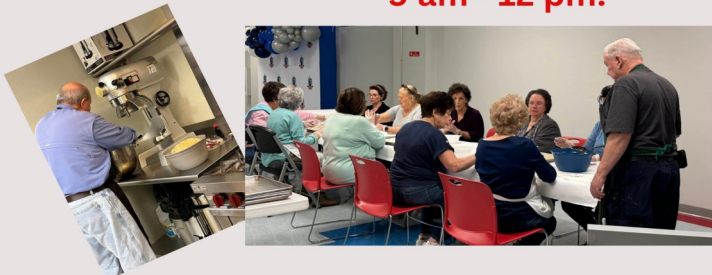

The 6 Characteristics of an Everyday Stewardship for Lent – Mindful

What is it that tempts you the most? Is it an action, a person, or a place? It is something that seems innocent enough, like a food, a drink, or an event? When you really start reflecting, you find that there are many temptations all around. Even if you are strong and never succumb to a certain temptation, it is still there waiting for a weak moment in your life.

One difficulty in the life of a disciple trying to live a stewardship way of life lies in the temptations we never actually see. We are too busy thinking about past failures or successes, or we are fixated on what possibilities the future holds that we miss the important things going on in the present. Jesus could be standing directly in front of us, but we miss him because we are looking everywhere except straight ahead.

Being mindful means that we are looking out for how and when God will call us this very day. Our decisions this day will have a huge impact on the future. If we only look to the future, we will miss those important calls to action. We may even find ourselves in a desert of sorts, looking for any way out we can find. However, God may need us to give of ourselves for a reason we cannot yet discern while in that desert. We need to stay awake, be aware, and look for His hand in all things. If we don't, we may even miss the pathway out of that desert when it presents itself.

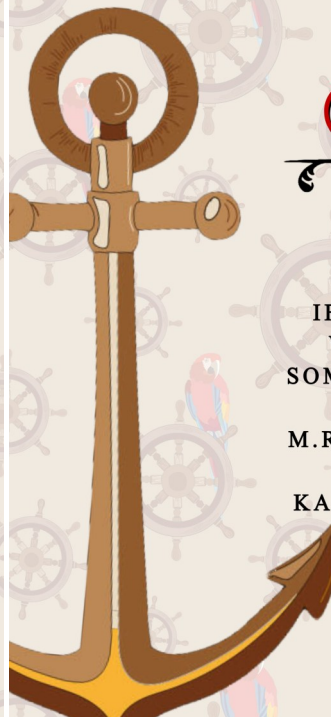

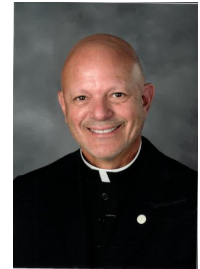
My dear parishioners,

Today we begin the Sundays of the Holy Season of Lent. The readings are always related to the temptations that Jesus battled in the desert during the 40 days of preparation for his public ministry, which become the reason for the 40 days of Lent. One important question could be, why highlight the temptations instead of the 40 beautiful days of retreat in the desert? Without the temptations, the desert makes no sense. In essence we could say that the reason Jesus went into the desert of Judea after his baptism with John was to let us know that the committed Christian life requires our battle with the Evil One. We would be naïve to think that the beauty of a time of preparation and retreat does not involve a battle against the sinful tendencies we have that come from the Original Sin described in the first reading today. As we enter this Season of Lent, let us enter with eyes wide open, knowing that like Jesus, we will need to battle our worst impulses. Make the sacraments your main sustenance during this Holy Season. Have a blessed Lent 2026!

For adults: Make sure you offer something up for Lent to discipline your body, but make sure you also think about why do we keep this Lenten time every year as a Church.

For parents with children: Help your children learn the value of sacrifice during Lent, by helping them choose a reasonable and true sacrifice during this season. Hint: TV time, cellphones and other gadgets make good choices to offer up.

WHY JESUS WAITS FOR ONE WORD FROM YOU BEFORE YOU RECEIVE COMMUNION

There is a moment at Mass that lasts less than one second. But heaven watches it closely. You step forward. The priest raises the Host and says: "The Body of Christ." And then, everything stops. Jesus waits. Not for angels. Not for music. Not for the priest. He waits for one word from you.

THAT ONE WORD IS "AMEN"

Most people say it softly. Some say it quickly. Many say it without thinking. But this little word is one of the boldest statements of faith a human being can make. "Amen" does not mean "okay." It does not mean "I agree a bit." Amen means: "This is true." "I believe." "I stake my life on this." When you say Amen before Communion, you are saying: "I believe this is not bread. I believe this is not a symbol. I believe this is Jesus Christ Himself, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity."

WHY JESUS WILL NOT FORCE HIMSELF ON YOU

Here is the shocking truth: Jesus never enters you without your consent. At the Annunciation, He waited for Mary's "Let it be done to me." At Communion, He waits for your "Amen." God always knocks. He never breaks the door. Your Amen is your free welcome. It is you saying: "Come, Lord Jesus."

WHAT HAPPENS IF YOU DON'T BELIEVE?

St. Paul gives a serious warning: "Whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily eats and drinks judgment upon himself." (1 Corinthians 11:29) This is why the Church insists:

- You must believe.
- You must be prepared.
- You must be in a state of grace.

Your Amen is not magic. It is a confession of faith.

HEAVEN HEARS YOUR "AMEN"

- When you say Amen:
- Heaven hears a confession.
 - Angels witness a covenant.
 - Christ responds by giving Himself to you.

This is why the Church does not say Amen for you. You must say it yourself. Faith cannot be borrowed.

FINAL THOUGHT

Jesus places Himself in the priest's hands. But He places Himself in your body only after hearing your faith. That tiny word, spoken by children, spoken by the weak, spoken by sinners longing for mercy, opens the door for God Himself.

So next time you step forward, don't rush it. Look at the Host. Hear the words. And when you say Amen, know this: You are not responding to bread. You are welcoming God.

Hoy comenzamos los domingos de Cuaresma. Las lecturas de hoy siempre se relacionan con las tentaciones de Jesús en el desierto durante sus 40 días de preparación para su ministerio público, que se convierten en la razón para los 40 días de Cuaresma. Una pregunta importante que nos podemos hacer sería, ¿por qué hacer énfasis en las tentaciones, en vez de mirar la belleza de los 40 días de retiro en el desierto? Sin las tentaciones, el desierto no hace sentido. En esencia podemos decir que la razón de Jesús ir al desierto después de su bautismo con Juan fue para dejarnos saber que la vida comprometida del cristiano requiere la batalla con el maligno. Seríamos muy ingenuos si pensáramos que la belleza del tiempo de preparación y retiro no envuelve una lucha contra las tendencias pecaminosas que vienen del pecado original descrito en la primera lectura de hoy. Al entrar en la Cuaresma, entremos con los ojos bien abiertos, sabiendo que, como Jesús, tendremos que luchar contra nuestros peores impulsos. Que los sacramentos de la Iglesia sean nuestro sustento durante esta santa temporada. ¡Que tengan una Cuaresma 2026 muy bendecida!

Para adultos: Asegúrense de ofrecer algo por esta Cuaresma como sacrificio para disciplinar sus cuerpos, pero más importante es pensar el por qué la Iglesia nos ofrece este tiempo de Cuaresma todos los años.

Para familias con niños: Ayuden a sus niños entender el valor del sacrificio durante la Cuaresma, ayudándoles a escoger un sacrificio razonable y real. Un consejo: tiempo en la TV, celular u otros juguetos son buenas alternativas.

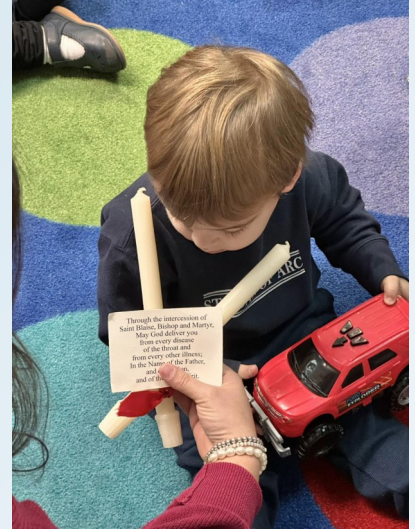

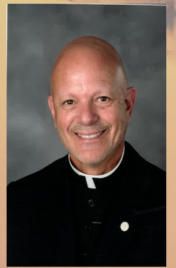

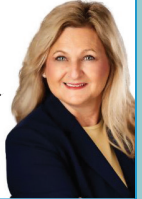
