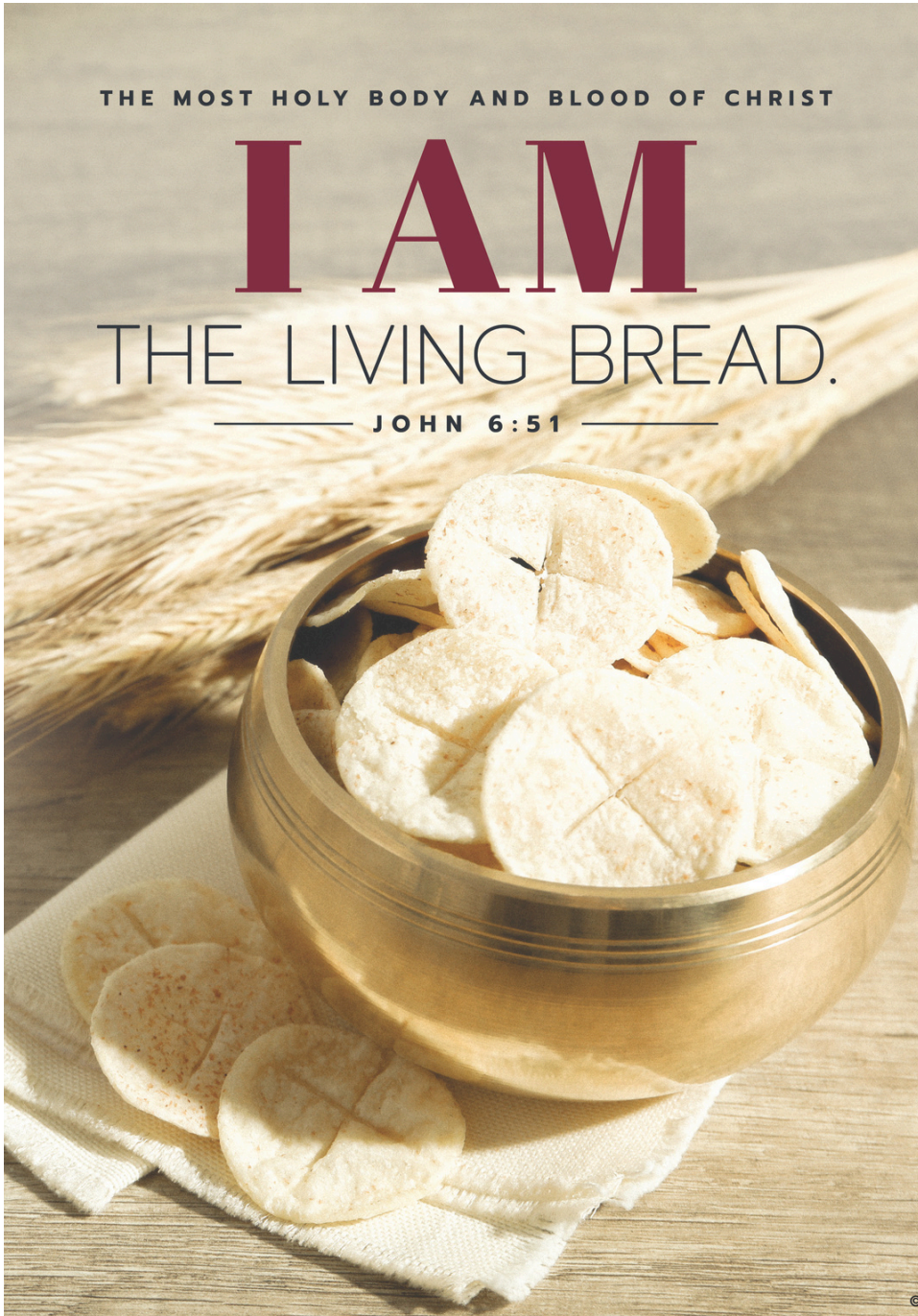

STEWARDSHIP

When I was a child I can remember stopping by my parish or another local Catholic church to just spend some time in prayer before the holy Eucharist. We didn't have exposition and adoration much in those days, but we were keenly aware of the presence of Jesus in the tabernacle. I would sometimes stare at the lighted candle near it and know that Jesus was alive.

I had never heard someone speak about a stewardship way of life back then. If I am honest, the primary message I heard back in those days was along the lines of we need to be as good as we are able. Sacrifice was only at Lent, disciples were people in the Bible, and generosity mostly had to do with the collection basket and the poor box at the church entrance. I even went to Catholic schools!

Maybe the message of stewardship was there somewhere packaged differently and I just missed it. It wasn't until I was an adult, and after acquiring two theology degrees, that I understood both with my head and my heart what a stewardship way of life really meant. But I look back at those days and I realize that the groundwork was laid for me to understand these things. It was those times before the holy Eucharist that I began to understand true sacrifice. It was at those times that I began to understand how actions and realities that seem so simple to the human eye can be so profound. And it was at those times that I began to see that true love knows no bounds. What does the holy Eucharist say to you about stewardship? Maybe today is a great time to reflect on your answer.

My dear parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. In a special way we honor, adore, and treasure the incredible gift of the Eucharist, which the Lord left us the night before He suffered for our salvation. The basic teaching of the Church is that after the consecration during the Holy Mass, the bread and wine are changed in their substance to the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ. This is the mystery called Transubstantiation which is a miracle that happens every day in our churches and altars! For us at SJA Church will also mark the first day we will have railings and kneelers installed in our beautiful altar which will give the possibility of receiving the Holy Eucharist kneeling down reverently. This is not a requirement, since our bishops have decreed that the preferable way in our country is to receive standing up, but no one can be denied the Eucharist for kneeling to receive it. It is the choice of the communicant, but whether kneeling or standing, the communicant must always be properly prepared, in the grace of God, and at the same time show a sign of reverence by genuflecting, kneeling, or bowing the head before receiving.

For adults: Take some time today to carefully read the instructions below.

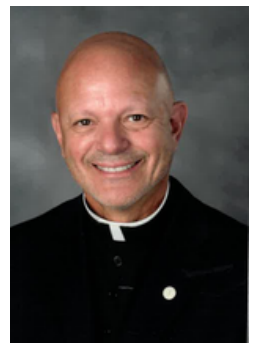
For parents with children: Teach your children how to receive communion properly and practice with them at home.

Reflections about my Invitations to our Parishioners and to our Families with Children

Today I would like to, very clearly and directly, explain to you the proper way of receiving holy communion:

- First decision you must make is if you will receive standing or kneeling.
- If you kneel, that constitutes the sign of reverence. If you stand, you must genuflect or bow your head when the person ahead of you is receiving communion.
- Second decision is whether you will receive in your hand or directly on the tongue.
- If you receive on the tongue, this can happen whether you are kneeling or standing, and you must put your tongue out horizontally and outside your mouth enough so that the minister will have space to place the host without it falling to the ground.
- If you receive in your hand, you must place your strong hand under your weaker hand and use your weaker hand on top as a paten or communion plate in order to have a clean and clear surface for the host to be placed. Do not put your hands next to each other. Your strong hand must be under your weak hand. The host will be placed on the palm of your hand and not on your fingers.
- You must use your strong hand underneath to pick up the host and bring it to your mouth to consume it, stepping slightly aside from the minister, but consuming in front of the minister to prevent taking the host with you to the pew. You must not share your host with anyone. You must also check for any fragments or particles of the host in your paten hand and consume them since any recognizable fragment is the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ. That is why the priest carefully purifies all the sacred vessels after communion. These are called the ablution or purification rites.
- Remember you are receiving the host and not taking the host, as you must have your weak hand fully extended with your strong hand underneath and not grab the host with your fingers like if they were a tweezer.
- When receiving from the consecrated chalice, you must also make an act of reverence, and receive standing up to prevent a possible spill.
- During a wedding, the couple can choose to receive communion under both species kneeling down.
- After a few times receiving correctly, this becomes second nature to you.

Teach

Jesus was called “Rabbi” or “Teacher” and shared the Good News through dialogue, parables, and teachings. He interpreted the Scriptures and applied their wisdom to present circumstances. In each successive generation, all who have ministered in the Lord’s name have been instructed by Christ to “make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you.” The Great Commission continues to this day within the Church’s ministries with adults, as pastoral leaders, families, and young people share the light of Christ and bring about a conversation of heart. This begins by responding to their realities.

Pastoral leaders and families who share the life and teaching of Jesus “are called to love and accept all people in a way that invites each person to a deeper relationship with Christ and a greater alignment of their lives with his teachings.” People will be able to encounter Christ through the Church, the sacraments, and the witness of our lives. Making a bold invitation of faith can help dispel the darkness and amplify the joys in a person’s life, allowing Jesus Christ to transform his or her lived experiences and bring about a conversion of the heart.

Pastoral leaders accompanying people, in concert with their families, share the faith as outlined in the Catechism of the Catholic Church. This includes a presentation of the life and teachings of Jesus Christ and all Scripture; the celebration of faith through prayer, liturgy, and the sacraments, rooted in the community of the Church; our moral and ethical teachings, grounded in the Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes; Catholic social teaching; and the call of the Lord to each person to take up their vocation and mission in the world. Forming people in the art of discernment is also critical, as this process can make their vocational journey, conscience development, and making good decisions in life more fruitful and Gospel-oriented.

Above and beyond anything we do in this world to listen and teach is the grace of God, wonderfully offered in the Eucharist, freely given for our salvation and transformation. It is our work to introduce people to this gift, to facilitate this sacred encounter in any way we can, so that Christ can encounter us. This is the ultimate teachable moment.


