

Fall Bazaar on Saturday!

We are happy to be able to have our fall bazaar this coming Saturday, after the pandemic prevented us from having one last year. It will look different than our recent bazaars, due to the circumstances we are all living through, but it will be a fun opportunity for our parish to gather together as a community outside of Mass.



All In For Jesus!

This year's bazaar will be entirely outside, to maximize safety during the pandemic.

Everything will be centered on the school soccer field, which is located behind the school. There will be live music, great food and drinks for sale, booths featuring different items, and an area of games and bouncy houses for the children. A new feature will be a barbecue competition... sounds finger-lickin'-good!

A Labor of Love

Long-time parishioners will notice that this year's bazaar won't have the white elephant sale, silent auction, and the other inside sales. Understandably, some of you might be disappointed, as these are very popular parts of the bazaar.

There are two primary reasons for these changes: health and staffing.

- Health: During the pandemic, we thought that it would not be prudent
 to tightly pack people inside our buildings as they look through items
 for sale. Thus, we needed to shift the focus to events that can be held
 outside.
- Staffing: The traditional bazaar needs a small army of volunteers to
 organize it months in advance. When we put out the call to the parish
 for help, almost no one stepped forward, likely due to the coronavirus
 situation. So members of our new Parish Life Committee, along with
 several of our staff members, have been working heroically to pull this
 together, with very little support.

As a parish, one of our strategic goals is to improve our community life (as seen on the opposite page). Thus, we decided it was better to try to put something together as best we could, rather than have nothing for two years in a row. The upcoming bazaar is a labor of love, to try to provide a fun and safe opportunity for our parish to gather together in a time when all of us have been burdened by so much isolation.



First Stained-Glass Window Installed

Gary and Eileen and their daughter Chelsea, gifted this window, Jesus Forgives Peter, to St. Peter's Church in memory of their son, Derek Simmonds Cantrell, who passed away in his sleep at home in Lynchburg, Virginia on June 14, 2020. He was only 35 years old at the time of his passing. Derek is interred at the Sacred Heart Section of St. Peter's Columbarium.



Derek, a gifted artist with a passion for mathematics and philosophy, cherished life and the beautiful wonders of the world that surrounded him. Though quiet and reserved, his love for his family and their pets, his keen artistic prowess and Catholic pride made Derek the kind hearted and beautiful person he was, and continues to be as he embarked on his new journey to his eternal home.

The family chose this window as they knew Derek would certainly have noticed the details in it, such as the upside-down cross in the boat, the sheep close to Jesus and Peter, and the group at the fire conversing. On his last visit to Beaufort, just two months before his passing, Derek was in awe of the picturesque water, boats and sunsets in the area, so similar to the scene in this window. Knowing and loving Derek for his short 35 years has left his loved ones with riches beyond measure. He would be so pleased to share the beauty of Jesus' message and the bright light shining through this window with all who enter St. Peter's over many years to come.

John 21:1-19

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." 
