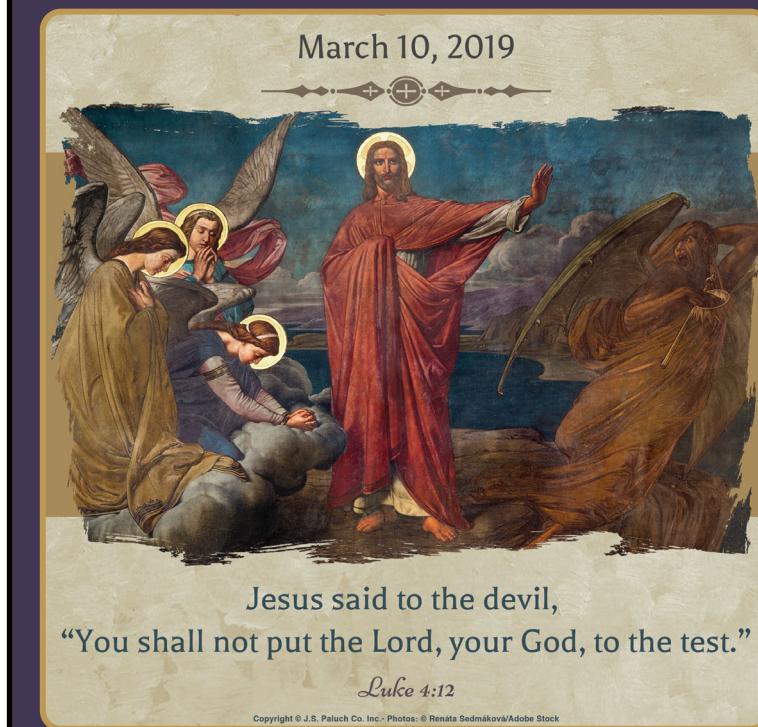

Almsgiving, Prayer, Fasting and Temptation

As we begin our season of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving, the reading from Deuteronomy reminds us of our duty of almsgiving, that we “set [our offerings] before the Lord, [our] God, [and] shall bow down in [God’s] presence” (Deuteronomy 26:10). The reading from Romans refers us to our prayer, reminding us that “The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart . . . For everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved” (Romans 10:8, 13). These are comforting words, and encourage us to ask God for what we need and to aid us in our prayer. Finally, the Gospel of Luke shows us a fasting Jesus, who was tempted as we are, and who knows what it means to be human. Someone once said that temptation arises when you’re tired and weary, and the devil comes along and makes a perfectly reasonable suggestion. Jesus shows us that, with his help, we too can overcome our temptations, reasonable as they may sound. *Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.*

Treasures From Our Tradition

Often, when a family keeps vigil around a person who is preparing for death, they may notice three interwoven activities. First, the dying person may become more prayerful and reflective than ever before, reviewing life’s journey in gratitude to God, or seeking forgiveness and making amends for wrongs. Second, as death approaches, the need to eat and drink is lessened until even an ice cube brushed against the lips is satisfying. Third, persons who are dying often make plans to give their possessions away, making bequests, handing treasures down, providing for favorite charities.

Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving: with these three “pillars” of Lent, we rehearse our death every year in this season, and anticipate the final work we will do in this life. And every year, at the end of our journey, is the joy of Easter and the experience of the victory of Christ over death’s darkness and power. Annually, we remind ourselves that the Christian experiences the same power and presence at the end of life’s journey: Christ to the rescue and the lasting joy of heaven.

Sanctuary Candles

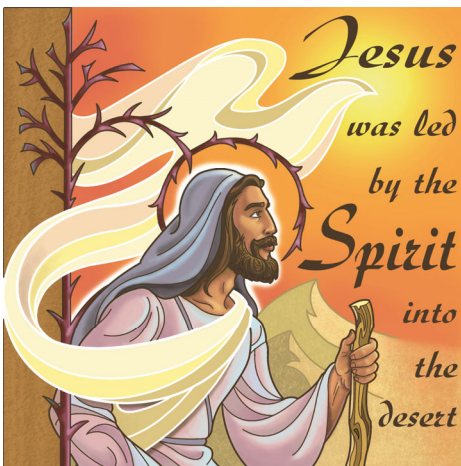

Putting God To The Test

I always thought today's Gospel shows how Jesus was tempted to be a Messiah in a way that matched human expectations—those of Jews waiting for a messiah—instead of doing what his Father wanted. But I also wonder if these temptations are what we expect of God.

Do we expect God to provide for our needs by turning stones into money? God does help us with our troubles, but usually by giving us the strength to get through them with our God-given abilities. This might mean finding a better job that uses more of our talents. It might be forgiving us, if we are the cause of our own troubles, and giving us the courage to start over.

Or do we expect God to bring peace to the world by instantly removing all nuclear weapons or capturing all terrorists? When we pray for peace, we could pray that God show us what we can do to bring that peace. We could be generous in giving to the poor, especially where poverty is the cause of war.

Maybe we expect God to be a superhero for us, strengthening our faith with spectacular miracles. Jesus would tell us the same thing he told the devil: "Don't put the Lord your God to the test" (see Luke 4:12). Instead, as we take time to pray over the scriptures, read spiritual books, and share our faith with others, we will find our faith growing and know that the Lord has been with us all along the way. *Tom Schmidt, Copyright © J. Greetings OLL!

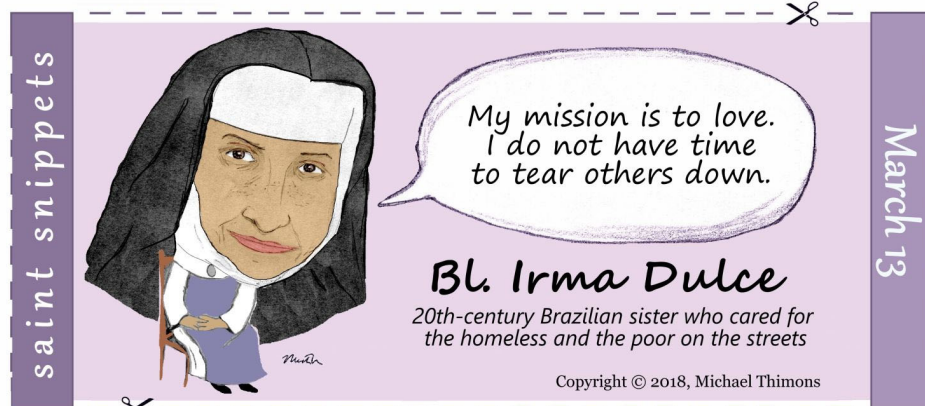

Divine Mercy– God's Greatest Attribute

From the diary of a young Polish nun, named Sr. Faustina Kowalska, a special devotion to the mercy of God is spreading throughout the world. The message is nothing new, just a reminder of what the Church has always taught: that God is merciful and forgiving and that we, too, must show mercy and forgiveness. But, in the Divine Mercy devotion, the message takes on a powerful new focus, calling people to a deeper understanding that God's love is unlimited and available to everyone - especially the greatest sinners: The greater the sinner, the greater the right he has to My mercy (Diary, 723).

Some of the elements of this new focus include a sacred image of the merciful Savior, several new prayers, and a cornucopia of promises. But the main elements are trust and deeds of mercy. Devotion to The Divine Mercy involves a total commitment to God as Mercy. It is a decision to accept His mercy with thanksgiving, to trust completely in Him, and to be merciful as He is merciful.

The devotional practices proposed in the Diary of St. Faustina ... are completely in accordance with the teachings of the Church and are firmly rooted in the Gospel message of our Merciful Savior. Properly understood and implemented, they will help us grow as genuine followers of Christ.

The focus of Divine Mercy Sunday, the eighth and last day of the Octave of Easter, is on God's unbounded love and mercy for us, sinful and broken humanity, manifested so visibly in Our Lord's Paschal Mystery and continually poured upon us through the Sacraments of Mercy - Baptism, the Eucharist, and Reconciliation. We honor God's mercy the most when we trust in Him, partake of the sacraments of His love, especially the Eucharist, and when we are merciful to one another.

Safe Environment Training

All those who serve in ministry with children are required to complete Safe Environment Training. Initial Safe Environment Training on the Northshore will be offered at St. Luke the Evangelist Parish in Slidell on the following dates: March 7th and April 4th. In the Fall, OLL will have trainings on August 7th at 10 AM and August 21 at 7:15 PM in the Chotin Center.

Renewal for Safe Environment Training for Adult Learners only is now being offered online. This training works on computers, tablets and smartphones. This is not for your initial training with the Archdiocese...only for renewals. Training expires every three years. If you are due for renewal, follow these steps:

1. Go to <https://safeandsacred-nola.org>
2. Click the "Create new account" button to register
3. Complete ALL information on the registration page
4. Click "Create my new account" to complete your registration
5. Click "Continue" to confirm your account and enter the training site.
6. Complete the training. You are done with training when you see your certificate on the screen.

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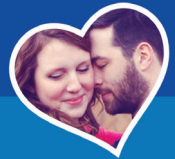
