Healing and Salvation

The readings today speak of healing and salvation. In Second Kings, Naaman, a commander of the army of the king of Syria, develops leprosy. He goes to a stranger, a prophet from Israel, when no one else can cure his disease. Much to his surprise, after a simple bath in the river, he is cured. In Luke's Gospel, Jesus cures ten lepers and sends them to the priest. Only one, a Samaritan, returns to thank Jesus for his cure and only he hears the words, "Your faith has saved you." The psalm and Timothy remind us that salvation involves justice, kindness, and faithfulness and forever links us with Jesus. Treasures From Our Tradition

Christian liturgy has always contained an opportunity to make a choice for sharing. From the beginning, Christians pooled their resources, especially for the care of widows and orphans, at the weekly Eucharist. Over the years, the collection became detached from the liturgy and baskets or plates would be passed through the community while the Mass was going on at the altar, or contributions would be collected at the doors. In Milan's Ambrosian Rite, these gifts have always been brought to the altar by lay people in procession. In German countries, the ancient custom was for the entire assembly to process with their gifts—first the men, then the women, then the priests and deacons—to offer their gifts at the altar. The old ceremony of canonization included a curious vestige of this procession: people would present the pope with two loaves of bread, two barrels of wine and water, five candles, and three cages containing pigeons or turtledoves! *Rev. Miracles of Faith

Besides being cured, what do Nathan (first reading) and the leper who thanked Jesus (Gospel) have in common? Both of them began to believe. Nathan proclaims Israel's God to be the only God. The only leper who returned to thank Jesus was "glorifying God in a loud voice" (Luke 17:15). It makes me wonder, what miracles do we see that help us grow in faith?

For an answer, we can look at a second thing they had in common: they both asked for help. Sometimes we get caught up in self-sufficiency mode, thinking we have to handle all our problems by ourselves. We may miss out on ways to solve those problems by not asking for help. If you think asking for help is a sign of weakness, you may be missing a chance for God to act through one of your friends and give you support. And, of course, you can ask God for help in prayer.

We may have friends who help us in times of need or inspire us with their faith, but we have to decide to make a leap of faith ourselves. The third thing that Nathan and the leper did in common was express their faith. You can spend your whole life thinking that you are a Christian, but if you never express that faith, it will be just a theory. St. Paul in the second reading, for example, was suffering in prison, but he didn't mind because his suffering demonstrated the importance of Jesus' message to him. So he wrote from prison in the hope that other Christians would be encouraged in their faith. Perhaps you know of someone who inspired you with their faithfulness and dedication. Having a friend who helps us grow in faith can be a very nice miracle indeed.

Vocation Spotlight: Joe Chautin

I was reluctant to write about my vocation story in the bulletin because it might come across as a desire for adulation or praise. But then I heard how someone else's vocation story had helped a young person choose a holy vocation, and I knew then it was time.

Catholicism surrounded me as a child. The second oldest of six, I watched Advent wreath candles melt at the dinner table. We prayed Sunday night family rosaries. We were taught the power of prayer (and that the Devil was real). We played Mass at home. As an altar boy, I saw Jesus up close, and witnessed the weekly rhythm of parish life, early weekday Masses with farmers, the joys of weddings, and every form of grief at funerals. Choir, Youth Group, Vacation Bible School? Yes, yes, and yes. Life was like one big Catholic cake, with layers of richness and goodness. That foundation (thanks Mom and Dad!) has never left me. Being Catholic was something special, taught at home; we took it with us into public school.

College came, and God connected me to the gift of my wife, Michelle, who joined me at weekly Mass. Though we were (and remain) imperfect, we've fought through and stayed close to our faith – through a stint in the USAF, law school, three lovely daughters and our careers. In 2008, I walked into a Men's Club meeting and got involved at OLL. Around then, I started spiritual reading, and credit Bishop Robert Barron with introducing me to the words "your life is not about you." Everything suddenly made sense. I realized then that I was always most joyful when I was doing for others. Then I read a story about Thomas Merton being overcome by a feeling that he was connected to everyone he encountered by the link of being God's creation. Then I read that God didn't stop creating us after we were given life, but is continuously sustaining and creating us. Inspired, I taught PSR at OLL for 7 years, following my daughter Gabby from 4th through 10th grade. By teaching, Jesus revealed Catholicism's beauty and completeness and truth. I taught my PSR kids that they should be doing backflips and cartwheels at how fortunate they were to be Catholic. I promised them they could join me at the end of the year, where I would do a perfect cartwheel. They didn't believe me, but my sisters had taught me well. I did a perfect one, and hope they never forget Catholic backflips. To teach me the beauty of human encounter, God called me to serve as Men's Club President, the church's lawyer for the 2011 new church effort, altar server coordinator, festival chair, and adoration chapel adorer.

Through it all, I learned that to really live life, you must give yours away. Only then are we most like our Savior, who emptied himself for us. When you see me, I hope you see God instead of me, through my actions. When I see you, I see God's face, and in your eyes, His gaze of gratefulness. It still shakes me to my core. Do you want to truly experience God? Then give yourself away, and make your life about everyone else, not about you.

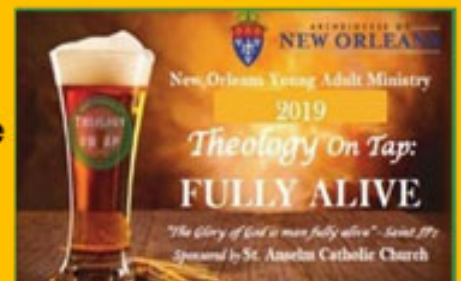

Renewal for Safe Environment Training for Adult Learners only is now being offered online. This training works on computers, tablets and smartphones. This is not for your initial training with the Archdiocese...only for renewals. Training expires every three years. If you are due for renewal, follow these steps:

5. Click "Continue" to confirm your account and enter the training site.

Financial Stewardship and RAS Status

Why should I give to the Church?

Contributions can be made online by credit card or direct debit through Online Giving. Go to our website at www.ollparish.info and click on the link. Set up the account and make a "Weekly Offering". Once you choose this option, you can further decide to make your payment monthly, weekly or one time. Be aware that credit transactions take 2-3 days to process.
