God's Words

Each day we are bombarded with thousands of words. From the moment our clock radios click on in the morning, until the last moment of the day when the television is turned off or someone bids us "good-night," our life is filled with words. Some words that we hear bring news that leaves us feeling low. Some words lift our spirits. Many of the words we hear are trying to get us to buy something. Some words are hurtful. Today the Church focuses our attention on hearing the word of God. Are God's words just more of the same—part of the endless stream of words that flow into our ears each day? The challenge today is to allow God's word to inspire us in new ways so that our outlook and attitudes align themselves more closely with the heart and mind of Christ Jesus.

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July 14: St. Kateri Tekakwitha (1656-1680)

Though the New York State Thruway runs close by the North American Martyrs' Shrine, traffic's roar never pierces the peace enveloping Auriesville—Ossermon to Native Americans—in the lovely Mohawk Valley, where Kateri Tekakwitha was born barely ten years after the martyrdom of Isaac Jogues and his Jesuit and lay companions. Daughter of a Christian Algonquin mother and non-Christian Mohawk chief, Kateri's parents died in a smallpox epidemic widely blamed on the missionaries. Moreover, many Native Americans had experienced exploitation at the hands of "Christian" traders and trappers, further discrediting the faith Kateri embraced in baptism, then pledged to live even more intensely in vowed virginity. Misunderstanding led to harassment, prompting her move to a Christian village farther north along the Saint Lawrence River. Despite this, Kateri's faith remained undaunted, her selfless charity undiminished. Both before and after her death at twenty-four, this young "Lily of the Mohawks" drew countless converts to Christ by the fragrance of her goodness. Through us, does "the aroma of Christ" (2 Corinthians 2:15), attract others to the beauty of his gospel? —*Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.*

Parables, Anyone?

Jesus threw out parables like a farmer sowing seeds. Some of them fell on the ears of those who would be disciples. But most fell on the ears of people not ready to understand. The path, the rocky ground, and the thorns are all metaphors for how his teachings were received. So how do we receive his word?

Do we hear it without understanding, letting it go in one ear and out the other? Do we hear it joyfully, but then forget it when troubles or difficulties come along? Do we listen to the word but ignore it in the face of later temptation?

If we want the word to grow strong in us, we can take steps to help ourselves understand it. We can come to church early and spend a few minutes with the readings before Mass. After Mass we can talk about the readings or the homily with our family over breakfast. We can pick out one practical point to practice that week.

God's word can be likened to a ball game. We can sit back and watch, not really involved or caring who wins. Or we can jump in and participate and make the game ours. Let us ask God how we can take the word and run with it.

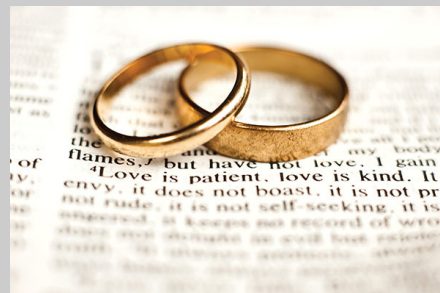

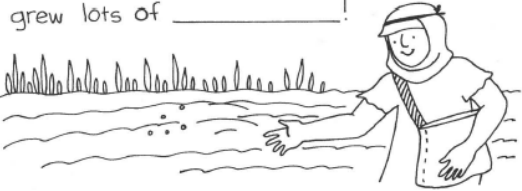

Are you called to be an Altar Server in our Parish?

How can altar serving help me grow as a Catholic? *Serving involves you intimately in the most important tradition of our Catholic faith. Servers lead us into Mass, in the procession of gifts, and as we leave Mass to live our faith in the world. Servers hold the Word of God for the priest. With the ringing of the bells during the Eucharistic prayer, servers rivet our attention to the altar. Serving calls us to holiness. Our altar server motto reflects that – “Holiness Through Service” or in Latin “Sancti per Ministerium.” In Pope Francis’ words, “the closer you are to the altar, the more you will remember to speak with Jesus in daily prayer, the more you will be nourished by the word and the body of the Lord, the better able you will be to go out to others, bringing them the gift that you have received.”*

What is the makeup of our group of altar servers at OLL? *Our corps of servers is about half male and female, with a median age of 13. We have servers who are home-schooled, from nearly every local public school and from Our Lady of the Lake School. It is a wonderful and diverse mix of individuals and personalities who participate to serve our Lord. Our logo and t-shirts set servers apart as a growing, vibrant, and dedicated youth in our church parish.*

Is there an age or grade limit for becoming an altar server? *Children can begin serving as they begin 4th grade and continue serving through 12th grade. Server teams usually have a mix of younger and older, more seasoned servers.*

Who trains the servers, and what is the training commitment? *At OLL, the Altar Server Coordinator (Deacon Owen Francis) conducts altar server training. Servers are required to attend at least one training session (about 1.5 hours) and parents are asked to attend a short informational meeting during that time. After training, a server can start signing up for Masses. Serving is really learned by serving, and early mistakes are understandable teaching moments. At OLL, altar serving is not a mechanical, robotic job, but instead is about becoming a part of and more deeply understanding the miracle of the Mass, our most perfect form of prayer. Other training sessions are scheduled throughout the year to reinforce earlier training and to add skills as they grow in Altar Serving*

What roles do servers have at Mass? *Servers hold the Cross or candles, hold the book that contains Mass prayers for the priest to read, ring the bells, bring various items to and from the altar, and help the priest wash his hands. They are sometimes called upon to participate in other ways as well. At all times, servers display a posture of holiness, reminding the congregation of the sanctity of our celebration.*

We are not always in town every weekend. Does that create an issue? *At OLL, we are blessed to have many altar servers. We are using a Sign Up Genius account so Altar Servers may schedule themselves as their situation allows. The slots are available up to a year in advance so you may plan accordingly. All Altar Servers are required to serve at least 2 times per month. The system is used in many schools and is quite easy to use.*

Are servers required to serve at high holy Masses or at other special times of the year? *No. We ask for volunteers for Easter Triduum and Christmas Masses, and at other Holy Days. Those who are available and want to serve enjoy being an integral part of the high points of our Liturgical Year. For some of these Masses, a practice is necessary.*

When can I sign up? *The altar server 2020-21 year runs from September 1, 2020 to August 31, 2021. The sign up form is online at [Altar Server Form](#) and will be made available via the OLL Website around June 1st. If you need to register any other way, please contact Deacon Owen. The commitment is for the full year. If you would like to serve, please do so prior to the first training session. We will have several sessions to choose from and you may attend more than one to reinforce the training.*

Does serving qualify for service hours that I may need? *Yes. Most schools and organizations, religious or secular, recognize altar serving as a full service hour for one Mass. Our altar server coordinator certifies service hours.*

I have other questions about altar serving. Where can I get those answered? *Additional information, including a welcome guide and letter to parents is available on the altar server web page at www.ollparish.info/altar-servers. You can also call the Altar Server Coordinator – Deacon Owen Francis, whose contact information is in the bulletin.*

Financial Stewardship and RAS Status

Why should I give to the Church? Only with the sacrificial offering of all our members, can we ensure that Our Lady of the Lake remains a vibrant, active faith community. With your offering you can ensure that we are able to meet our financial obligations to maintain our ministries, programs and facilities, pay a just wage to our parish staff, support the needs of the larger Church and assist our brothers and sisters in need.

What is RAS? RAS stands for Registered, Active and Supporting of the parish. When registering for the school or for PSR classes, each family is asked to be a Registered, Active and Supporting member of the parish. Our Lady of the Lake has set a minimum financial amount of \$450 per family, per calendar year to be considered an RAS member. Those who do not meet these requirements are asked to pay an additional fee.

How can I fulfill my RAS minimum amount for 2020? Make contributions weekly, monthly or one time prior to the end of 2020 to total \$450. When giving cash, please use envelopes with donor identification for proper accounting. Contributions can be made online by credit card or direct debit through Online Giving. Go to our website at www.ollparish.info and click on the link. Set up the account and make a "Weekly Offering". Once you choose this option, you can further decide to make your payment monthly, weekly or one time. Be aware that credit transactions take 2-3 days to process.

St. Bonaventure
