



FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT MARCH 21, 2021





Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

One of the devotions that I have really learned to appreciate over the years during Lent is The Stations of the Cross. They traditionally follow the path of Christ from Pontius Pilate's praetorium to the tomb of Christ. It is an incredible way to spend some time with Christ and walk in His way.

Around the 16th century, this pathway was officially entitled the *Via Dolorosa* (Sorrowful Way), or simply the Way of the Cross or Stations of the Cross.

According to Catholic Straight Answers, tradition holds that our Blessed Mother visited daily the scenes of our Lord's passion. When Christianity was legalized in AD 313, this pathway was marked with its important stations. St. Jerome (342-420), living in Bethlehem during the latter part of his life, attested to the crowds of pilgrims from various countries who visited these holy places and followed the Way of the Cross.

Over time, this devotion continued to grow in popularity. In 1342, the Franciscans were appointed as guardians of the shrines of the Holy Land.

William Wey, an English pilgrim, visited the Holy Land 1462, and is credited with the term *stations*. He described the manner in which a pilgrim followed the steps of Christ.

Because of the Muslim being in the Holy Land, actual visiting the original sites became very restricted. However, reproductions of the Stations were created. Many of these stations were produced by renowned artists and are considered masterpieces today.

At the end of the 17th century, the erection of stations in churches became more popular. In 1686, Pope Innocent XI, realizing that few people could travel to the Holy Land due to the Moslem oppression, granted the Franciscans the right to erect stations in all of their churches and that the same indulgences would be given to the faithful for practicing the devotion as if on an actual pilgrimage. Pope Benedict XIII extended these indulgences to all of the faithful in 1726. Five years later, Pope Clement XII permitted stations to be erected in all churches and fixed the number at 14.

The number of Stations has remained at 14 to this time (the 15th is the Resurrection of Jesus).

Over my life, I have grown to embrace the time I have spent meditating on the Stations of the Cross. This year, we hope to have a meditation on the Stations using the Memoria as the visual. This was developed by Fr. Ken Schmitt. The plan is to have this recorded and ready for Good Friday! I do hope you are able to view this recording. May it help you draw closer to Jesus as we continue this Lenten journey to Easter. May God bless you all.
