

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

What does Black History Month and St. Teresa of Avila have in common? According to Fr. Josh Johnson in his book, ON Earth as it is in Heaven: Restor-



ing God's vision of Race and Discipleship, St. Teresa was the granddaughter of a Jewish man who had been forced to convert to Christianity. She would experience discrimination from her fellow Carmelite sisters. At the time, any sister who had Jewish or Moors blood were alienated. This was based on a Spanish policy that required nuns to prove that they were descendant of Christians and no one else.

The saint would remove this "purity of blood" requirement when she established the Discalced Carmelites.

This act of St. Teresa may have inspired Venerable Henriette Delille. Born in 1813 as a free person of color. Wanting to be a nun, she was never invited by a religious order because of her race. The Archdiocese of New Orleans finally gave her permission to establish a community of Black Sisters in New Orleans.

Blessed Henriette chose to take her vows on October 15, 1851. This day is the feast day of St. Teresa of Avila. This was a very deep statement Blessed Henriette made and a powerful voice for racial inclusion for the whole Body of Christ.




